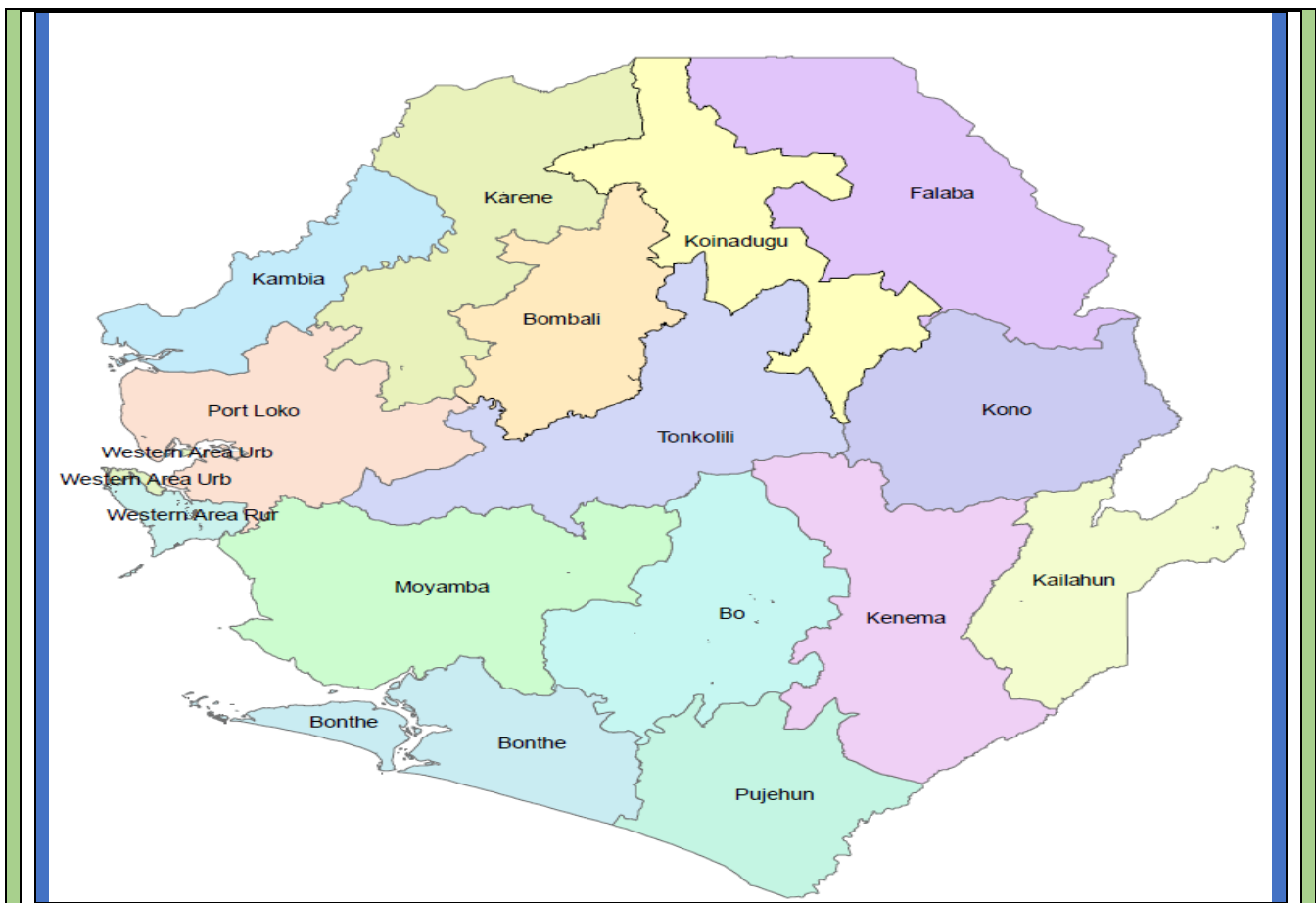



1.0 INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGY

1.1 Introduction

These district fact sheets have been produced as the first major output of the Parliamentary Budget Office and it aims to provide an overview of key development indicators across selected thematic development subjects in Sierra Leone. This is against the backdrop that the availability of dependable and quality information, and evidence are both central in reinforcing the work of Parliament in its work of providing representation of its constituents, scrutiny and oversight of the executive. The growing need for Members of Parliament (MPs) to be well informed about issues relating to the budget and the country's development, and their exceptional role in relating the concerns of the people and the government requires a consistent approach in information gathering and use to inform policy decisions.

Therefore, these district fact sheets will highlight the status of the performance of selected development indicators in Sierra Leone, which relate to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), agreed to in 2015 by the 193 UN member countries. It is important to note that these 17 SDGs constitute hundreds of targets and indicators which must be monitored and tracked while countries implement their national development plans.

So far, the Ministry of Planning has taken the lead in producing a Simplified Version of the 2030 Agenda and SDGs, sensitized the public on the new goals, undertaken national debates on SDG issues, and importantly so, they have also drafted the Sierra Leone specific SDG indicators with baselines and targets. What this means is that the need for robust implementation of government programmes and the continuous monitoring of development indicators will be critical to the actualization of the country's development targets and the SDGs.

Being one of the three fundamental arms of government, the legislature should be able to access and make use of relevant data which will contribute towards strengthening the quality of debates in Parliament and ensuring that political deliberations are guided by statistical evidence. These district fact sheets will therefore provide statistical information which will help MPs better exercise their role in holding the executive accountable, and in making informed decisions when scrutinizing the national budget and monitoring activities implemented by the government. Furthermore, the data contained herein shows evidence regarding which government programmes have been effective in delivering favourable outcomes from the investment of public resources.

The report shows information for the sixteen districts in all the five regions in Sierra Leone, namely, Eastern, North Western, Northern, Southern, and Western Area. This will ensure that readers are able to compare values of indicators for both regions and districts and assess how much progress has been made in the respective sectors.

The segments for which information have been shown in these district fact sheets include demographics, electoral statistics, education, economy, poverty, housing conditions, health, food security, law and order and agriculture. Clearly, this document will serve as a set reference, lone exhaustive and unique information source for MPs to know their district in terms of data.

It is important to note that the Parliamentary Budget Office (PBO) started operations in the Parliament of Sierra Leone in December 2017, following understudy visits made by (MPs) to the Parliaments of Uganda and Ghana, with the support of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP). The office has been established to provide independent, objective and non-partisan analysis on the country's budget, public finances and the economy, with a view to strengthening Parliament's influence and oversight on the national budget process.

Going forward, it will particularly strive to engage in rigorous budget and macroeconomic analysis and research and provide Parliament with timely and quality

information which is needed to aid its operations. While the existence of the PBO is yet to be provided for by legislation, it is anticipated that an amendment to the Parliamentary Service Commission Act will bring the PBO into legal existence to enable it to do its work more effectively.

1.2 Methodology

The preparation of these district fact sheets involved data collection, computation and analysis from a broad range of secondary sources including official reports, surveys, websites and administrative data of both government, and non-government institutions in Sierra Leone. More specifically, the information captured in these factsheets were taken from the following sources:

- i. Sierra Leone 2015 Population and Housing Census National Analytical Report, its selected thematic reports and the reanalyzed population figures based on the new administrative divisions, all from Statistics Sierra Leone;
- ii. National Electoral Commission of Sierra Leone 2017 Ward Boundary Delimitation Report;
- iii. 2013 Poverty Profile for Sierra Leone, jointly published by the World Bank Poverty Reduction and Economic Management Unit, Africa Region, and Statistics Sierra Leone;
- iv. Annual Health Sector Performance Report 2016, Ministry of Health and Sanitation;
- v. State of Food Security in Sierra Leone 2015, Comprehensive Food Security and Vulnerability Analysis (CFSVA), published by the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Food Security (MAAFS), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), and the World Food Programme (WFP); and
- vi. Administrative data from the Bank of Sierra Leone, Sierra Leone Postal Services, the Office of the Master and Registrar of the Court of Sierra Leone and the Justice Sector Coordination Office.

The data in these fact sheets are reported at both district and regional levels, to allow for wide comparison across different parts of the country. The statistics for the Eastern, Southern and Western Area regions and their districts have been captured as officially reported in the source documents.

For the North Western region, the statistics for Port Loko and Kambia districts are also shown based on the official reports of the source documents. All the data for Karene district are assumed to be the same for Bombali except for demographic information, electoral statistics, and Law and Order indicators. This is against the backdrop of the fact that most parts of the land area of Karene was taken from Bombali, and the performance of the selected indicators will be the same for the two districts.

Similarly, the statistics for Bombali, Koinadugu and Tonkolili districts in the Northern region are stated based on the official reports of the source documents. This is however different for Falaba whose indicators, except for demographic information, electoral statistics, and Law and Order, are assumed to be the same for Koinadugu, as it used to be part of the latter before the new boundary delimitation exercise.

1.2.2 Demographic Information

The demographic information, including the distribution of population by chiefdom was sourced from the reanalyzed population figures, except for the population density; percentage of disables, which was taken from the SL 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Disability; and the population by constituencies taken from the Ward Boundary Delimitation Report published by the NEC.

1.2.3 Education and Literacy

Figures for the literacy rate, primary, junior and senior secondary schools, and post-secondary education were obtained from the SL 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Education and Literacy.

1.2.4 Economic Characteristics

Under this section, the major economic activities have been shown to give an indication of the predominant occupation (s) of the working population of each region and their districts, as highlighted in the SL 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Economic Characteristics. The paid employment-to-population ratio and the labour force participation rate have been sourced from the same report.

The main crops produced is according to the data captured in the SL 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Agriculture. Based on this report, the food and tree crops with the highest volumes of production have been reported in these fact sheets to mean main crops produced. The number of commercial and community banks, and the operational post offices were obtained from administrative data of the Bank of Sierra Leone, and the Sierra Leone Postal Services respectively.

1.2.5 Poverty

The income poverty and gini coefficient indicators were sourced from the 2013 Poverty Profile for Sierra Leone, while the multi-dimensional index was taken from the SL 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Poverty and Durables.

1.2.6 Access to Basic Services by Households

The indicators mentioned in this section were obtained from the 2015 PHC Summary of Final Results. The final values for each indicator reflect PBO calculations which have taken into account the number of individuals with access to the relevant services, expressed as a proportion of the total population.

1.2.7 Health

The maternal mortality, prevalence of HIV in adults receiving counselling and testing, the prevalence of malaria in under-fives using microscopy indicators were accessed from the 2016 Health Sector Performance Report published by the GoSL Ministry of Health and Sanitation. The same report provided information on the number of PHUs, hospitals, doctors, midwives, and community health workers and assistants. The life expectancy at birth, under-five mortality, and children under five years with full immunization indicators were obtained from the 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Life Tables, the 2013 Poverty Profile for Sierra Leone, and the 2015 PHC Summary of Final Results respectively.

1.2.8 Food Security

To show the status of food security in the country, data on the prevalence of food security and insecurity, and the households with acceptable food consumption are captured in these district

fact sheets from the State of Food Security in Sierra Leone 2015, Comprehensive Food Security and Vulnerability Analysis (CFSVA), published by the MAFFS, FAO and WFP.

1.2.9 Law and Order

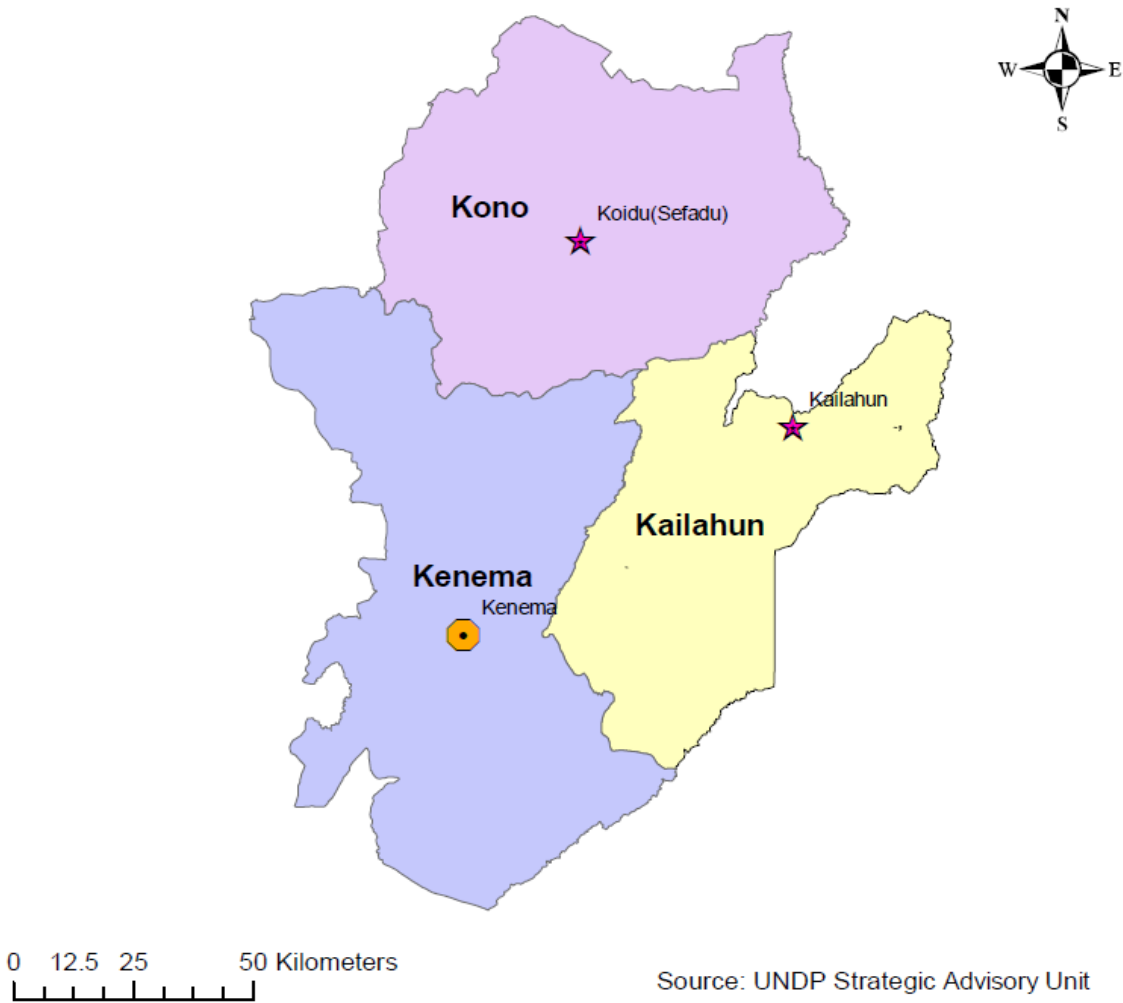
This section contains information on the number of magistrates, judges and police stations. The data was provided by the Justice Sector Coordination Office and the Sierra Leone Police.

1.2.10 Agriculture

As for the data on Agriculture, the 2015 PHC Thematic Report on Agriculture was used to provide information on the volume of the different agricultural crops produced, and the proportion of agricultural households which have access to assets, machinery and equipment.

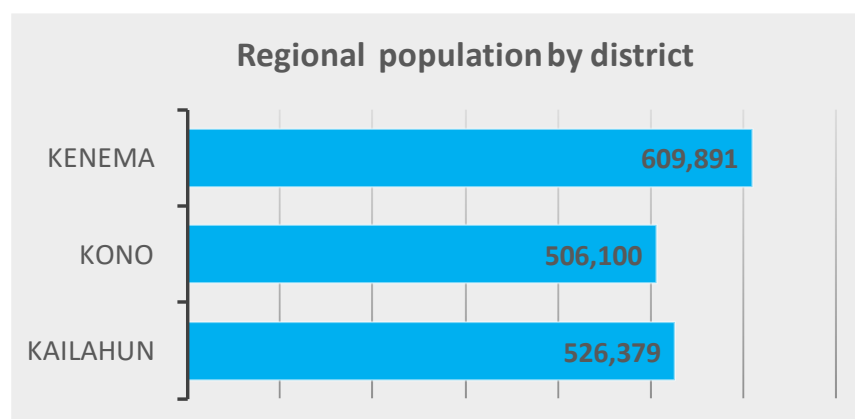

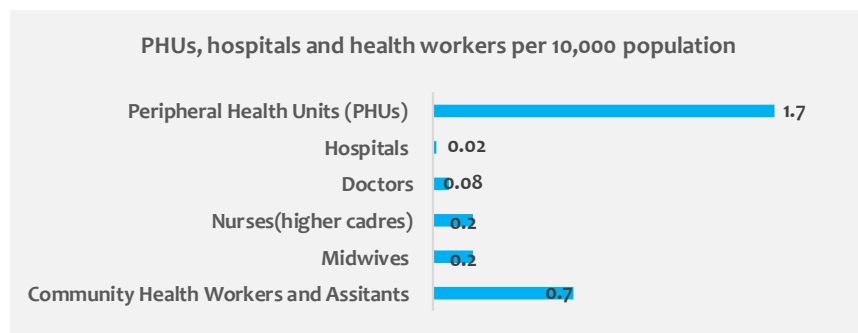

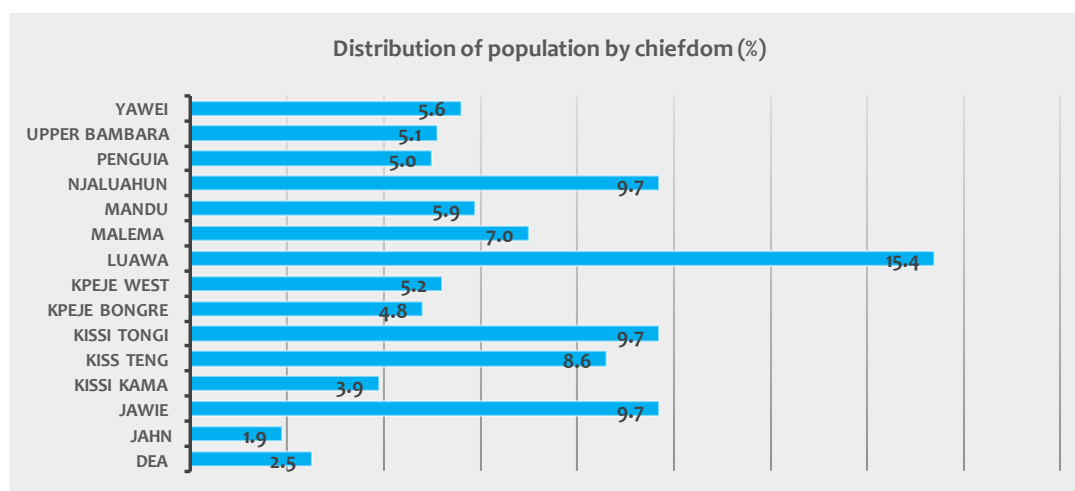

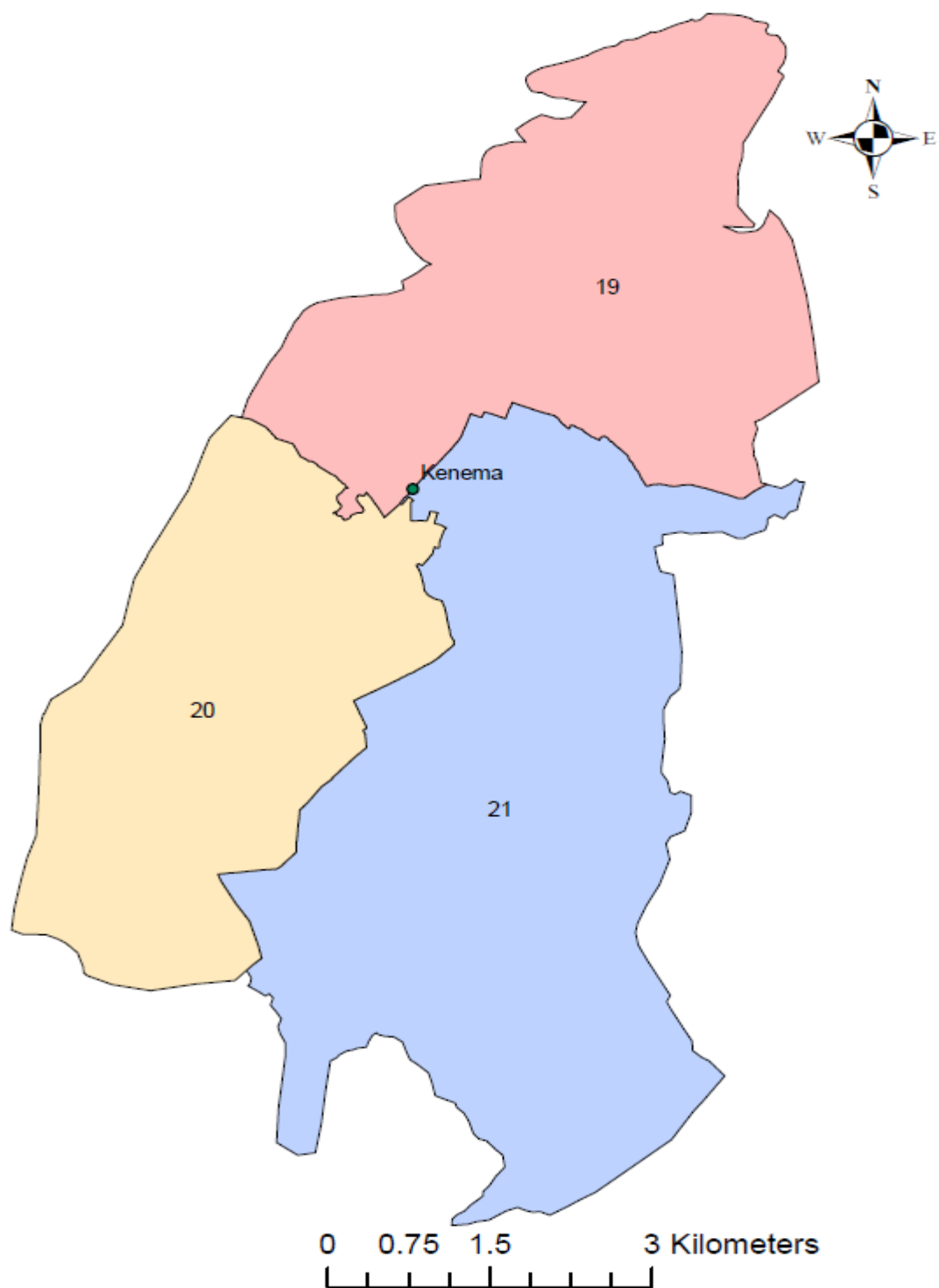

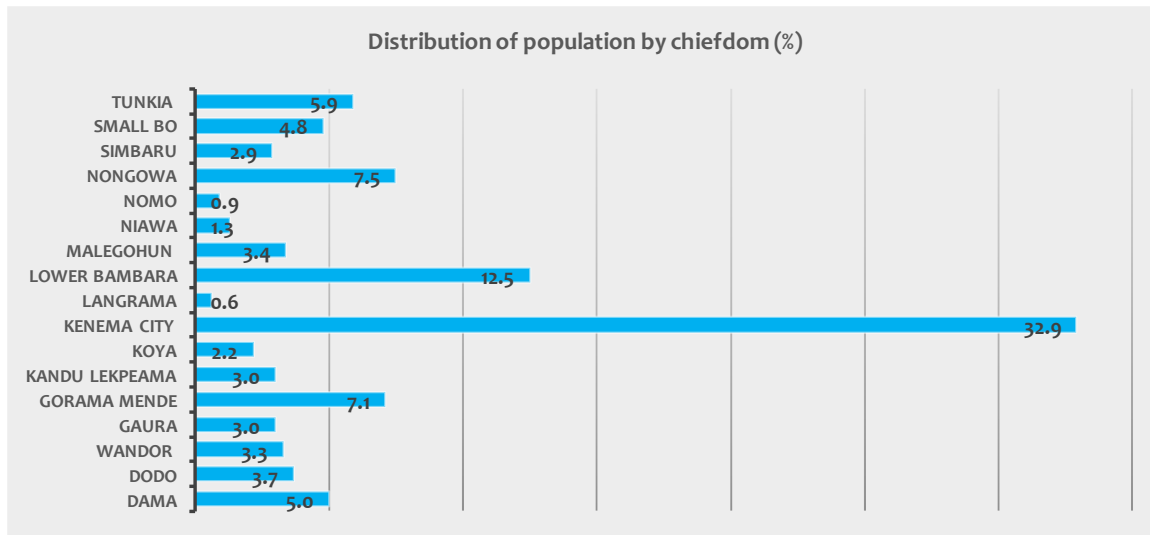
2.2.1 Constituencies in Kenema District Within Kenema City

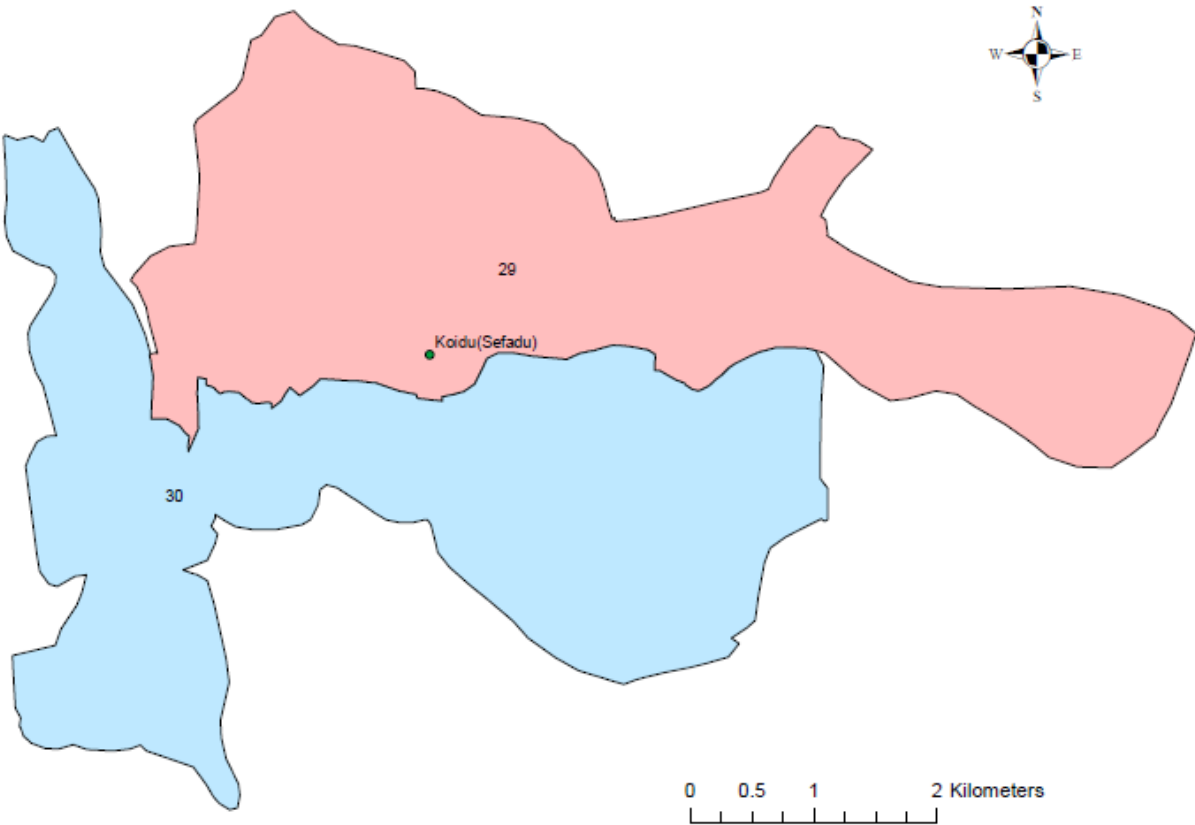

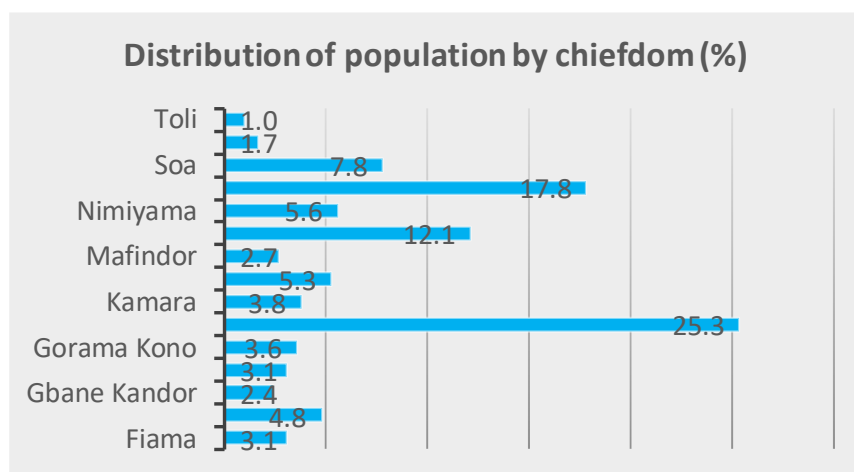

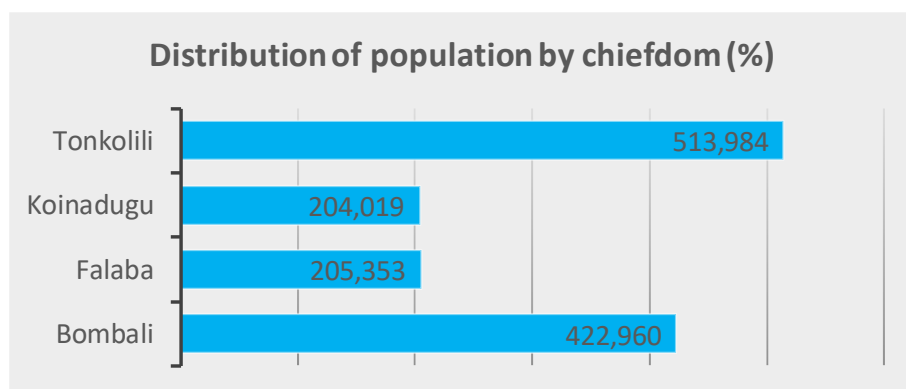

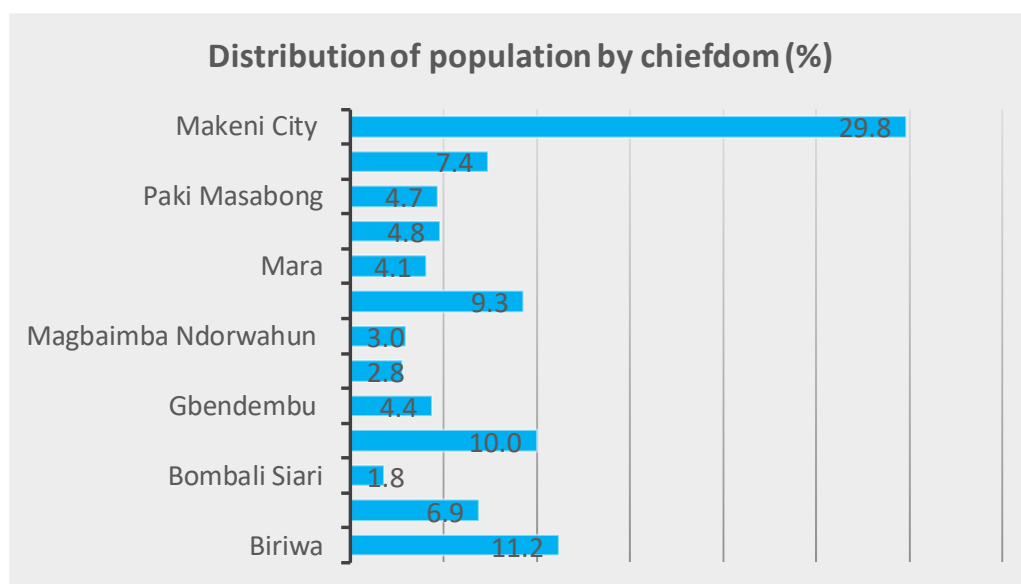

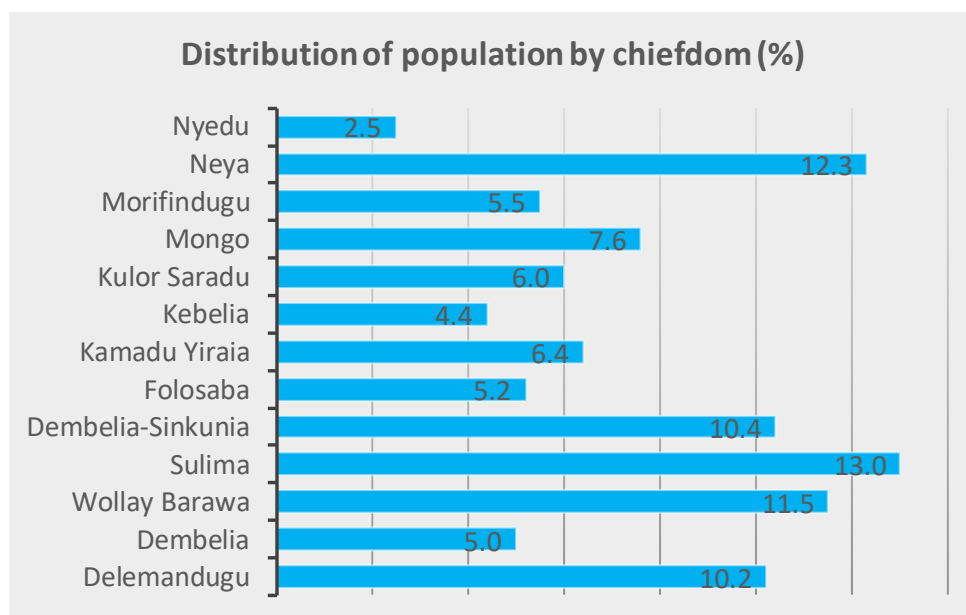

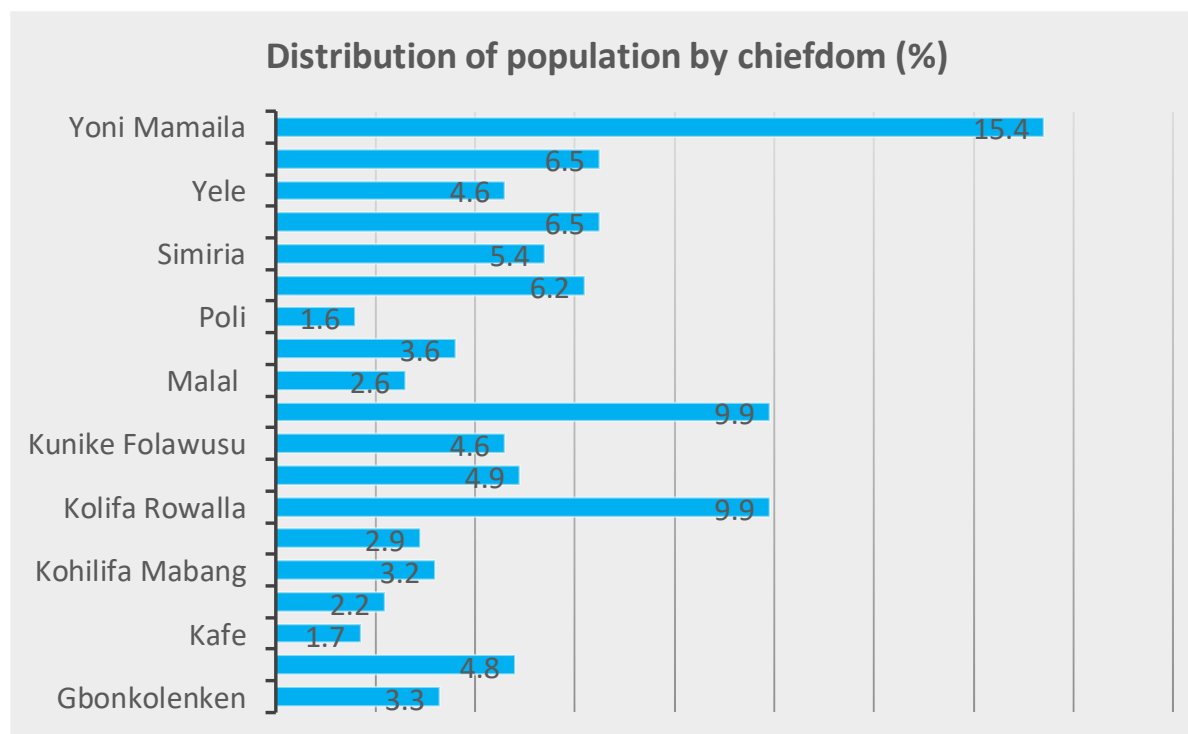

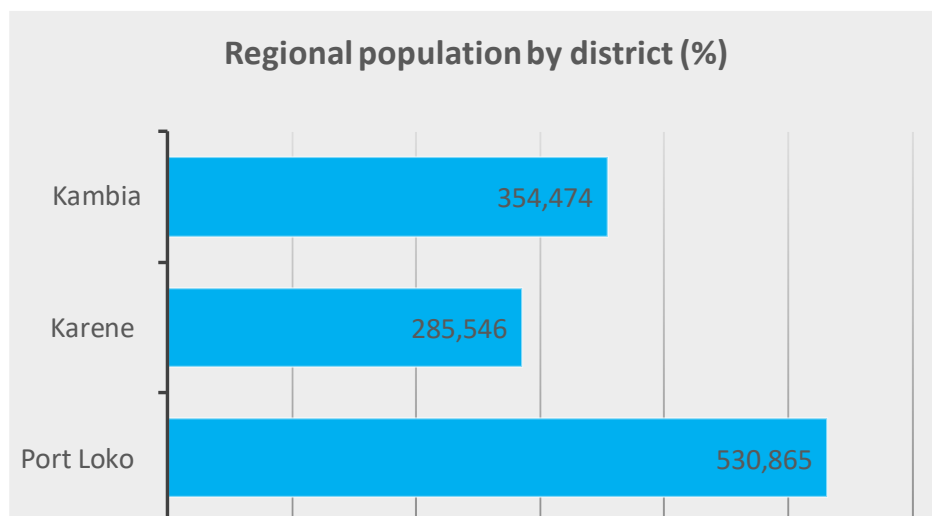

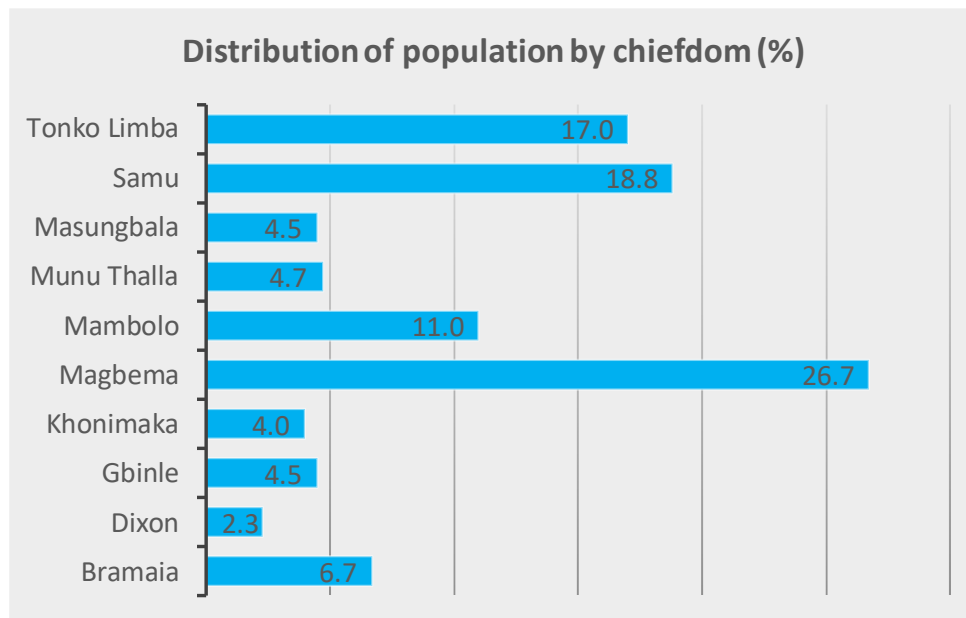

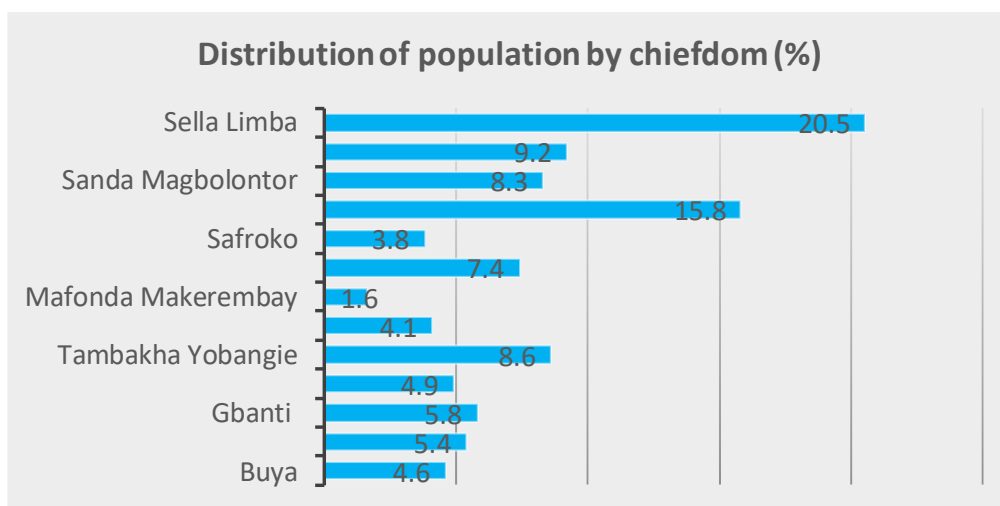

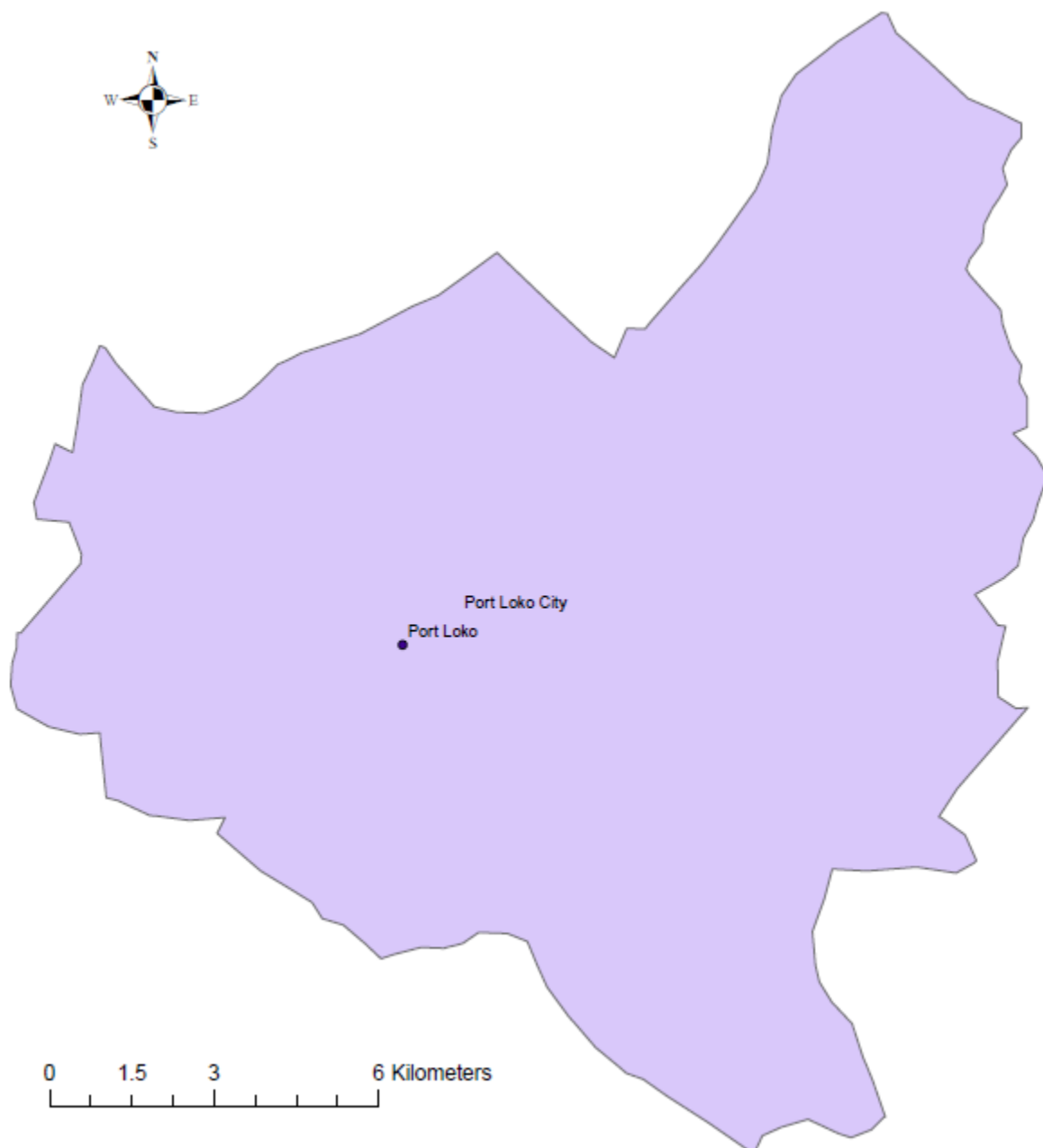

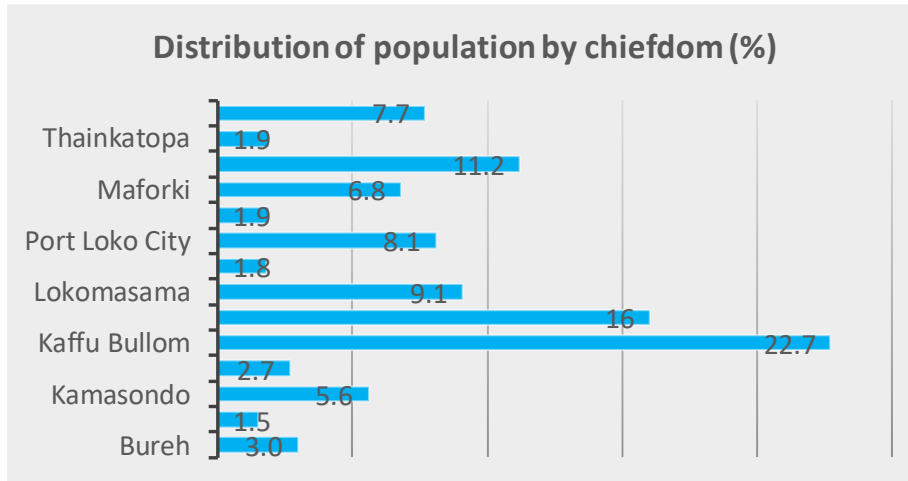
4.3.2 Constituencies in Port Loko District Within Port Loko City

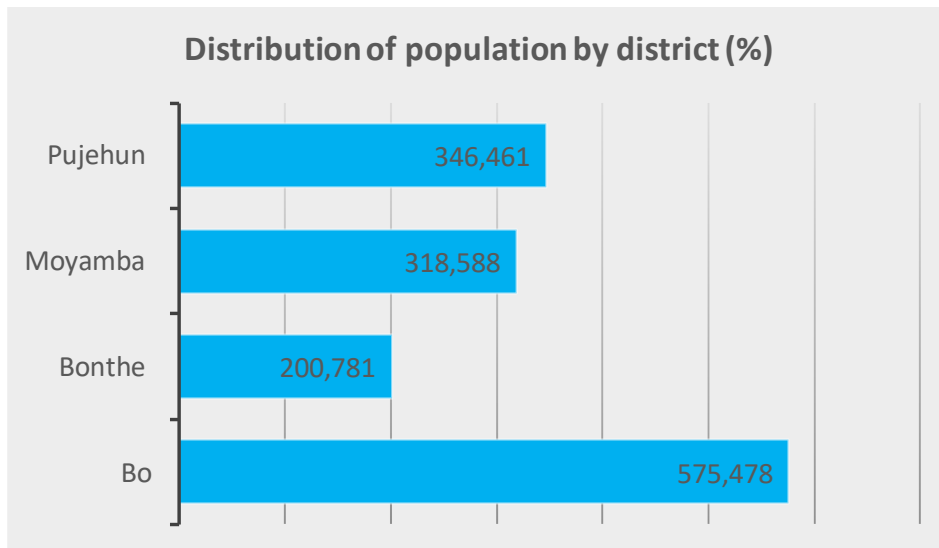

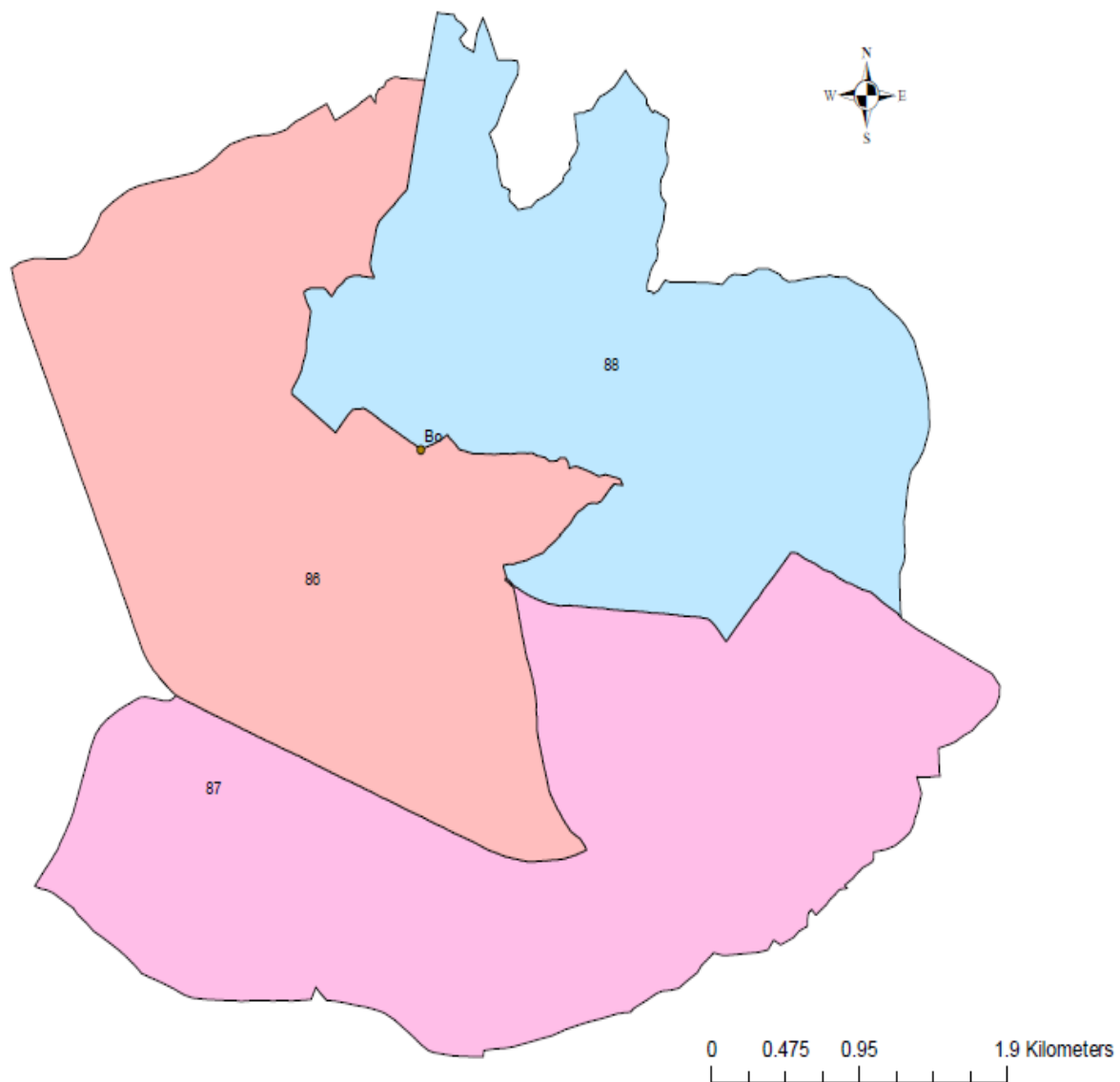

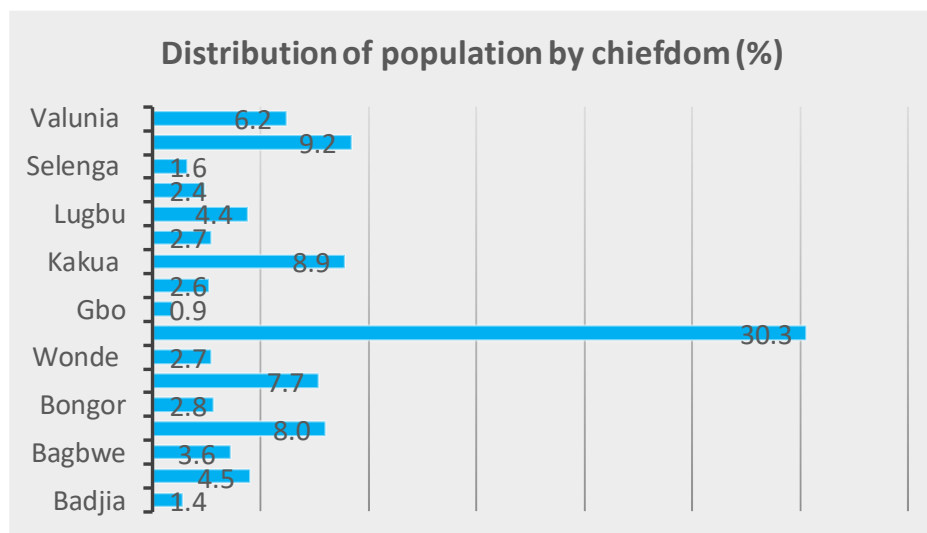
5.1.2 Constituencies in Bo District Within Bo City

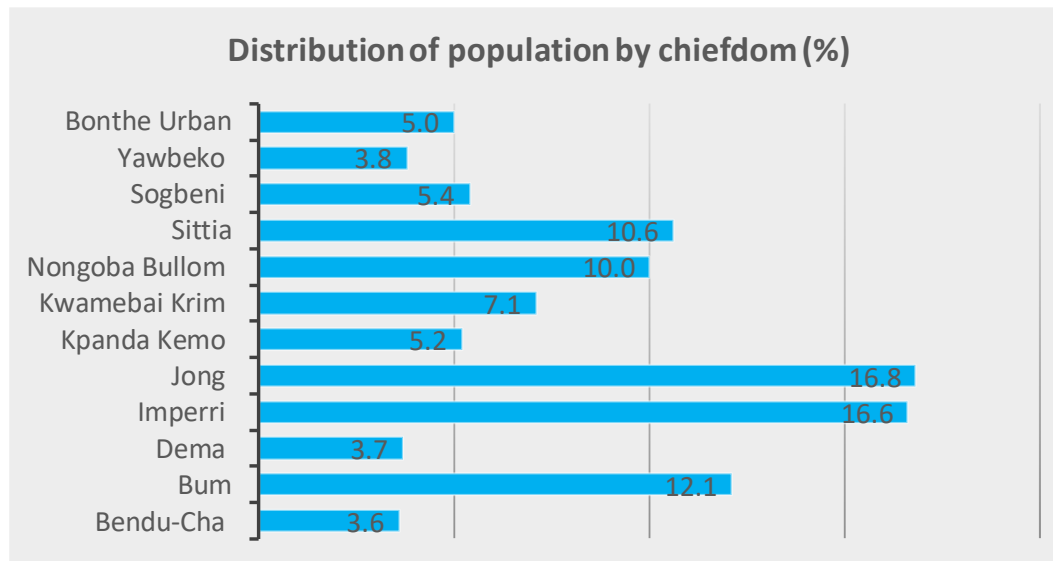

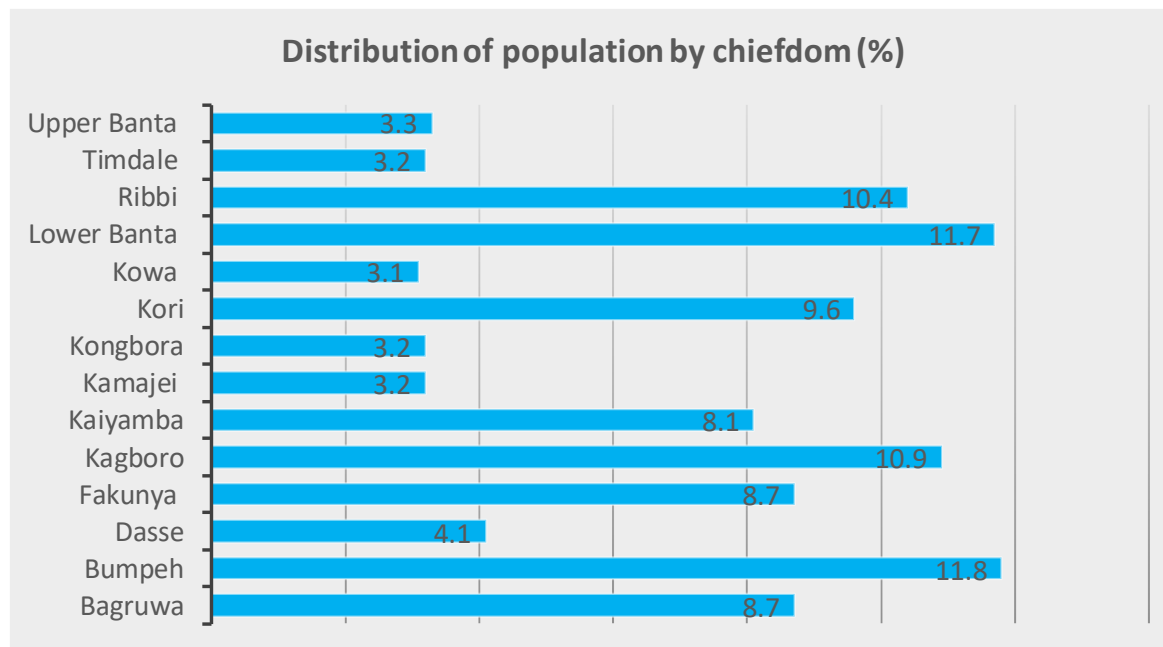

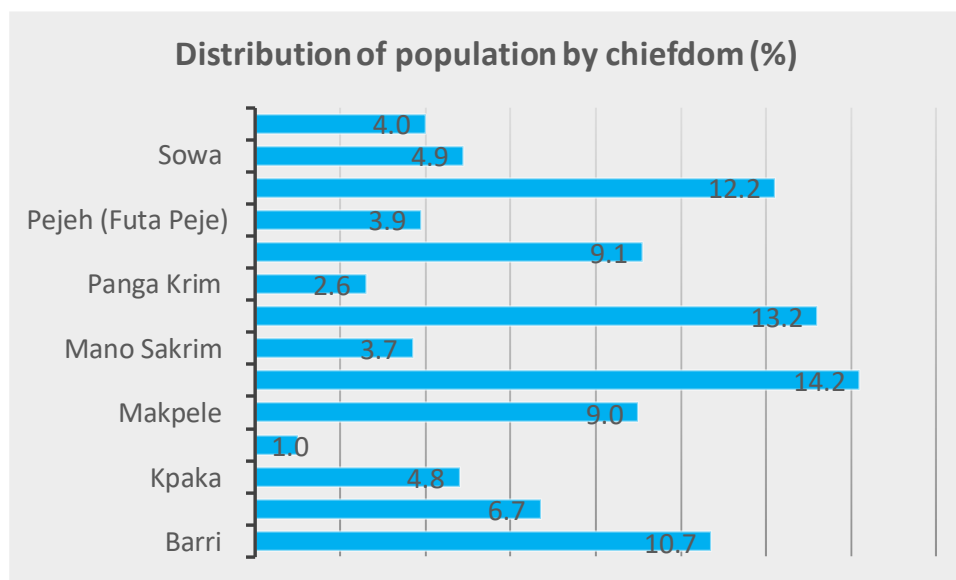

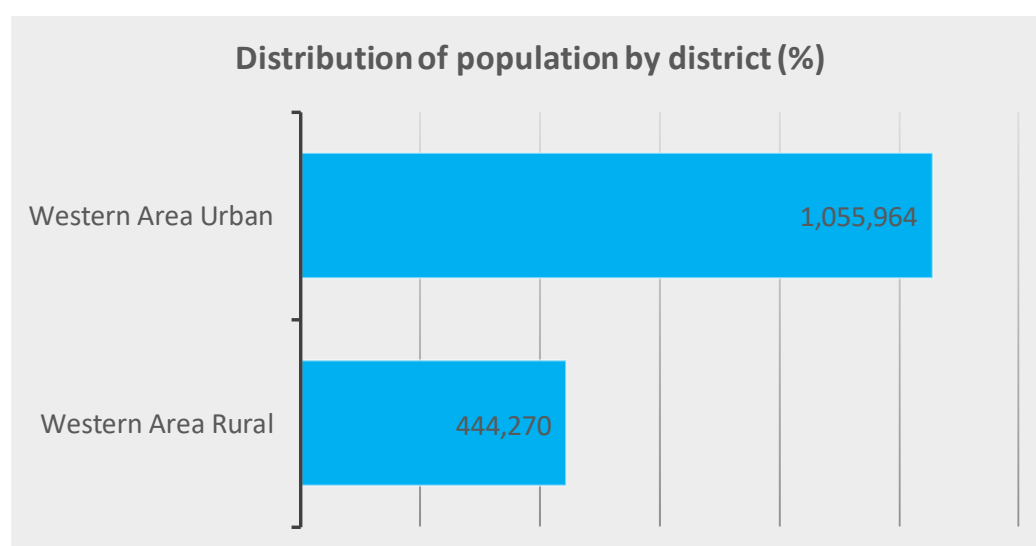

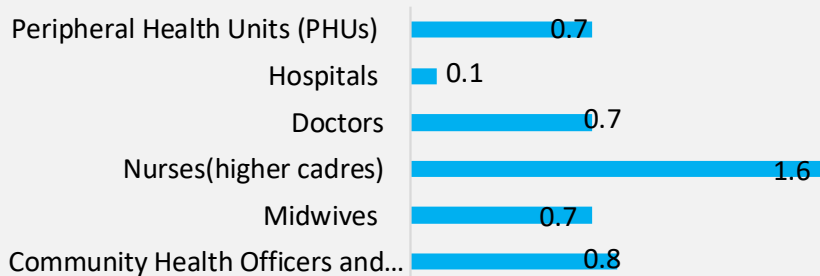

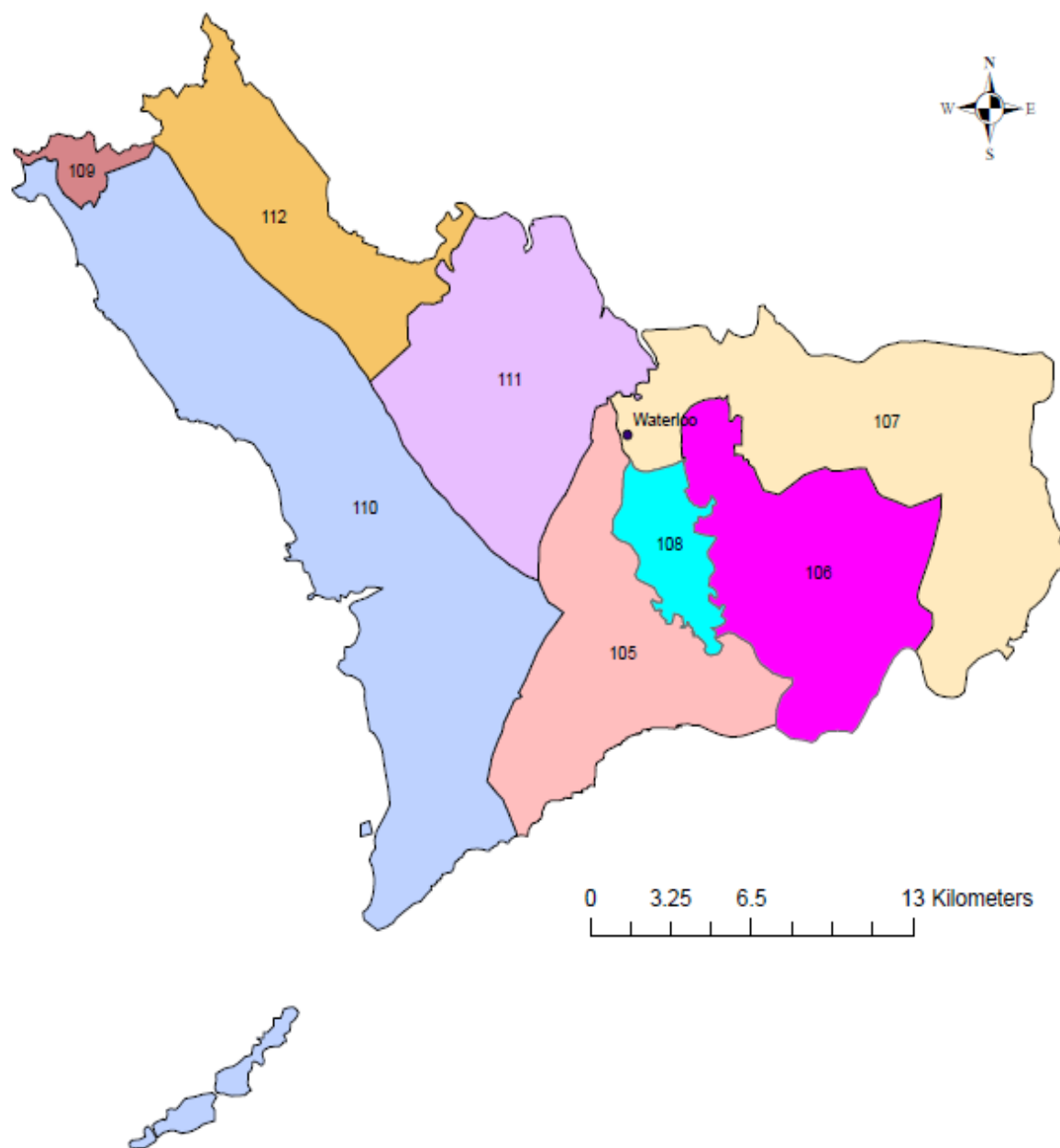

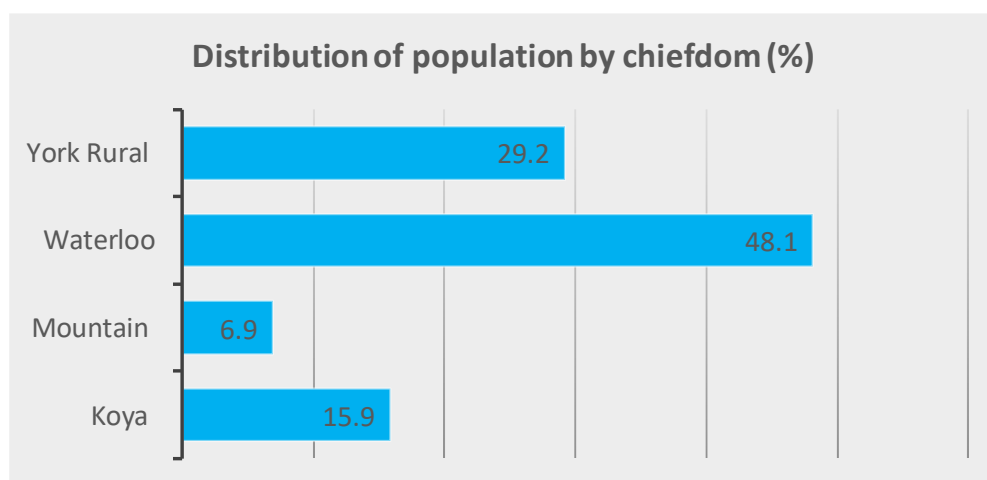
6.1.1 Constituencies in Western Area Rural District

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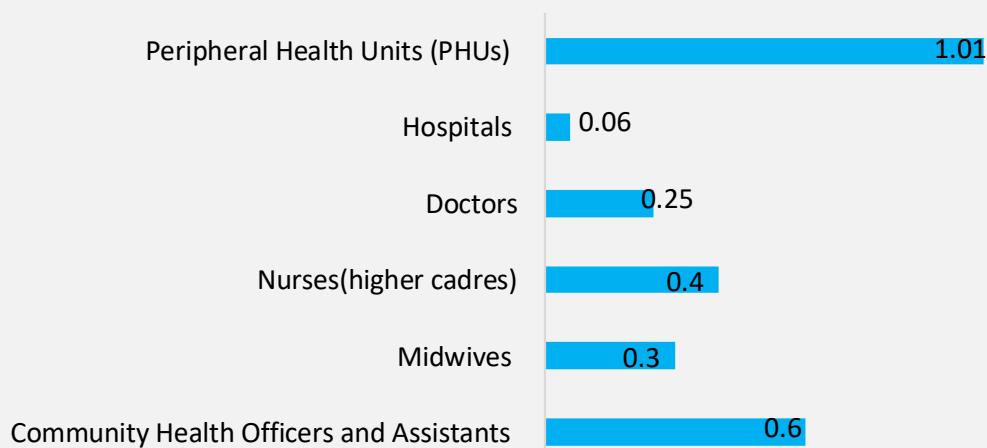

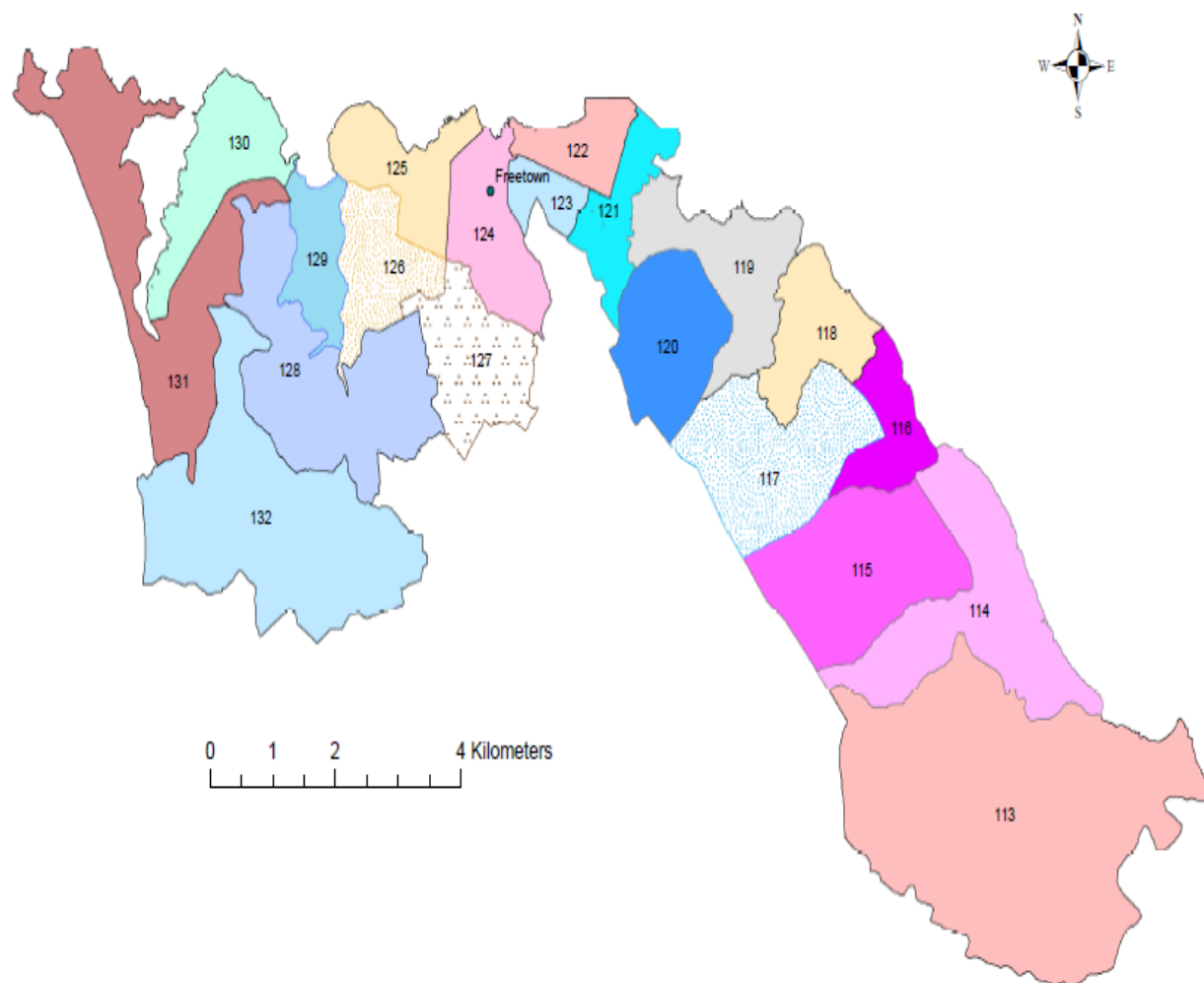

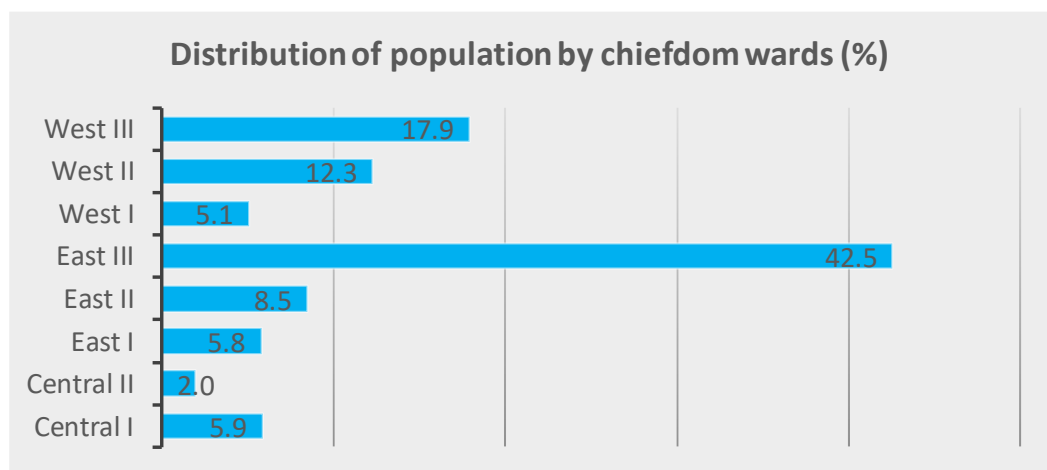
6.2.1 Constituencies in Western Area Urban District

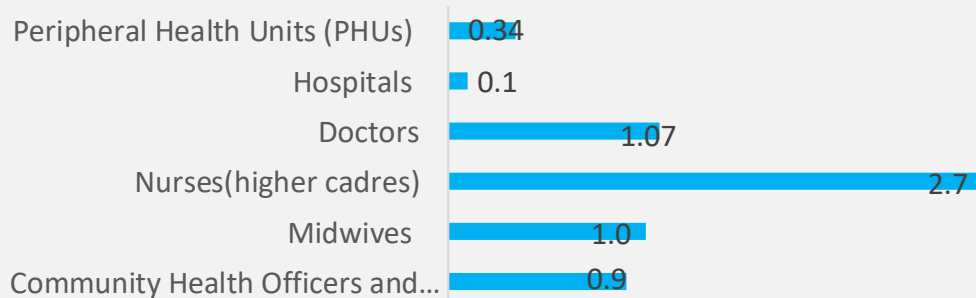
