Short title.

Being an Act to amend the Telecommunications Act, 2006.

J Date of com-mencement.

ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled.

"ICT" means Information and Communication Technology, which involves technology used to gather, store, use and send information, including the use of computers or any other communication system;
