CAPACITY BUILDING FOR STAFF OF PARLIAMENT

The Parliament of Sierra Leone, with support from the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) has on Thursday 4th March 2021 commenced a three-day capacity building for staff in the Human Resource/Administrative Department.

In welcoming participants for the training, Senior Committee Clerk and IPU Desk Officer, Mary Kowa nee Koroma said the workshop is intended to improving the knowledge of Human Resource/Administrative staff for efficient and effective service delivery in respect of modern human resource management practices.
