Parliament Bids Farewell to Rev. Alusine Diamond Suma of Westminster Foundation for Democracy

The Parliament of Sierra Leone has officially bid farewell to Rev. Alusine Diamond Suma, former Country Director of the Westminster Foundation for Democracy (WFD), in a heartfelt ceremony recognizing his six years of dedicated service and partnership, on Monday 08/09/2025 at the Center for Strategy and Parliamentary Studies.

Chairing the event, Sheku Lamin Turay, Director of the Parliamentary and Public Relations Department, acknowledged Rev.
