1. Prayers were read by Mr. Alimamy Lincoln Bangura (Table Clerk).

#### 2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2) at 11:35 a.m.

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 11:35 a.m. was moved by **Hon. Alusine Kanneh** of **Constituency 013, Kenema District** for the commencement of proceedings. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Josephine Makieu of Constituency 014, Kenema District** and approved by the House.

#### 3. Amendment of Order Paper:

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District moved a motion to amend the Order Paper by expunging item (IV) (i) (Laying of Paper by the Deputy Speaker of Parliament). The initial item (IV) (ii) then became item (IV) (I), and a new sub item (IV) (ii) (Laying of Paper by the Minister of Energy) was incorporated. The motion was seconded by Hon. Dickson M. Rogers of Constituency 100, Pujehun District and approved by the House.

#### 4. Adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2023:

The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2023 was moved by **Hon. Habib Keifa Fabbah of Constituency 078, Bo District**. It was seconded by **Hon. Alice Jebbeh Kumabeh of Constituency 092, Bonthe District** and adopted by the House.

#### 5. Announcement by Mr. Speaker:

**The Rt. Hon. Speaker, Dr. Chernor Abass Bundu** informed the House about a letter he had received from **Hon. Dr. Zainab Gimba**, Chairperson of Commonwealth Women Parliament, Africa Region. Mr. Speaker described the letter as very timely and important as he read out its content; The title of the Letter, **Election Sensitization Campaign to the Parliament of Sierra Leone, 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2023**.

"It's my great honour on behalf of the Commonwealth Women Parliamentarians (CWP), to extend warm greetings and to also inform Rt. Hon. Speaker of our intension to visit Sierra Leone for a sensitization campaign on the forth coming elections in Sierra Leone.

As you may be aware, CWP Africa Region is an organ established under Article 15 of the CPA Africa Region Constitution, with the objective of promoting gender equality and equity in the work of the CPA.

One of the roles of the CWP is to visit Member Parliaments that are going for general elections to lobby for increased representation of women in positions of power and decision making.

It is against this background that the Chairperson and members of CWP Steering Committee wish to conduct election sensitization campaign to the Parliament of Sierra Leone from  $2^{nd} - 6^{th}$  May 2023. All costs for the visit will be borne by the CPA Africa Region.





While looking forward to your kind consideration, please accept Mr. Speaker, the assurances of my highest regards.

#### Dr. Zainab Gimba, MP. Chairperson – CWP Africa Region."

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Chernor Abass Bundu**, further explained the implications of the letter he had read out for the edification of the House and the general public. He said that the Fifth Parliament had done itself the singular honour of demonstrating to the world at large its commitment to increase women representation in Parliament for which he said they deserved to be applauded for. He said that they had gone further to translate that commitment into law.

To remind the House of the law, Mr. Speaker referenced section 58 of **"The Public Elections Act, 2022" (Act No. 17 of 2022)**. He read out the relevant provision of that sub- section as quoted: **"For every three candidate nominated under sub-section (1), one of them shall be female"**. Mr. Speaker reminded the House that it was an undertaking by political parties and that they had done their bits as a Parliament. He said that under the Proportional Representation (PR) that would inform, control and govern the elections, each political party providing list for Members of Parliament would have to abide by that law. He stated that the failure to meet that provision, the returning officer was duty bound to reject the nomination of that political party. He further said that they as a Parliament had done their bits and it was the responsibility of the political Leadership of the political parties to ensure with a view to increase the female representation in Parliament was not in the position to micromanage the affairs of political parties, and that Parliament would not go against the remits of its powers.

He further said that he wanted to send the message to the Leadership of political parties through the Leadership in Parliament to make sure that the relevant provisions in **"The Public Elections Act, 2022"** were strictly adhered to.

Mr. Speaker appealed to the Parliamentary leadership of parties represented in Parliament to take heed and to convey the message to the Leadership of their parties outside of Parliament. He stated that there would be serious implications for non-compliance, and that the world would be watching.

The Deputy Minister of Transport and Aviation, **Mr. Rex Bonapha**, moved that the Bill be read the Third Time and passed into law.

#### Mr. Speaker put the question for vote as quoted.

"All those in favour, say Aye."





#### "All those against, say Nay."

Through collection of voices, Mr. Speaker declared that the Ayes had it.

The Table Clerk, Ms. Kema Sam Kpakra, pronounced that the Bill entitled: "The Civil Aviation Act, 2023" with its long title: "Being an Act to provide for the repeal and replacement of The Civil Aviation Act, 2019 (Act No. 7 of 2019), to provide for an effective aviation safety and security oversight system; to provide for the incorporation of the requirements of the Chicago and Montreal Conventions into domestic law and to provide for other related matters" had been read the Third Time and passed into law.

Mr. Speaker extended his thanks and appreciation to the Deputy Minister of Transport and Aviation for piloting the said Bill into law.
