1. Prayers were read by Mr. Alimamy Lincoln-Bangura (Table Clerk).

2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2) at 11:40 a.m.

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 11:40 am was moved by **Hon. Dickson M. Rogers of Constituency 100, Pujehun District** for the commencement of proceedings. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Hindolo Tennyson Sandy of Constituency 120, Western Urban District** and approved by the House.

3. Amendment of Order Paper:

The Leader of Government Business (Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District) moved a motion to amend the Order Paper by incorporating a new sub-item "B" under the main Item IV – Laying of Papers so that the Minister of Trade and Industry would lay the papers incorporated into the amended Order Paper. The motion was seconded by Hon. Dickson M. Rogers of Constituency 100, Pujehun District and approved by the House.

Mr. Speaker stood down the House at 12:00 p.m. so that the electrical problems experienced in the chamber would be resolved.

The House resumed at 12:30 p.m.

The Proceedings Continued.

4. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2) at 12 Noon:

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 12:30 p.m. was moved by **Hon. Dickson M. Rogers of Constituency 100, Pujehun District** for the proceedings to continue during lunch. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Boston Munda** of **Constituency 021, Kenema District** and approved by the House.

5. Adoption of The Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 9TH March, 2023:

The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 9th March, 2023 was moved by **Hon. Alieu Ibrahim Kamara** *of* **Constituency 122, Western Urban District**. It was seconded by **Hon. Ishmail Sama Sandy** of **Constituency 080, Bo District** and adopted by the House.

6. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, reminded the House about Section 58 (2) of the "**Public Elections Act**, **2022**" which stipulates as quoted: "**For every 3 candidates nominated under subsection** (1), one of them shall be female." He informed the House that he had received representations from a number of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) asking Parliament to reconsider its position on that particular provision. He said those CSOs wanted Parliament to go beyond its remit which he was not inclined to accept because the remit of Parliament was to pass the law and to provide the basic framework of the law for all and sundry to comply. He stated that the act by CSOs to tell Parliament to adopt the position of telling political parties where to place their female candidates on their lists was beyond the permissible, and that the said act by CSOs to tell Parliament to do the impossible was





tantamount of asking Parliament to micromanage the internal affairs of political parties of which Parliament was not legally permitted to do. He noted that it was incumbent on the political parties to demonstrate to the nation their commitment to increase the representation of women in Parliament as by law established, and that they had to decide as to where to place their female candidates on their lists before they would present them to the Electoral Commission of Sierra Leone (ECSL). He also referred the House to the proviso of subsection (7) of "The Public Elections Act, 2022" which states as quoted: "Provided that the returning officer shall reject the Nomination of Candidate made in contravention of subsection (2)." He stated that the onus was on the political parties and not Parliament. He said that as quoted: "if there is an attempt to pass the ball to Parliament, on your behalf, I am going to throw the ball back to them." He reminded the House about the dissolution of the Fifth Parliament between then and 25th April 2023. He said that it was their fervent hope that the Sixth Parliament that would be ushered in after the general elections in June 2023 would bring a quantum leap of women representation in Parliament.

7. Laying of Papers:

The Table Clerk, **Alimamy Lincoln-Bangura**, called upon The Minister of Lands, Housing and Country Planning to lay the paper that was itemized on the Order Paper.

A. Paper Laid by the Minister of Lands, Housing and Country Planning:

The Minister of Lands, Housing and Country Planning, Dr. Turad Senesie, laid the following paper:

Joint Venture Agreement by and between The Government of The Republic of Sierra Leone Represented by The Minister of Lands, Housing and Country Planning and TAF Africa Global Limited.

The Table Clerk, **Alimamy Lincoln-Bangura**, called upon The Minister of Trade and Industry to lay the papers that were incorporated into the amended Order Paper.

B. Papers Laid by the Minister of Trade and Industry:

The Minister of Trade and Industry, **Dr. Edward Hinga Sandy**, laid the following papers:

- i. An Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and Global Lite Refinery Sierra Leone Limited (GL-REFINERY) March, 2023.
- ii. An Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and Five Star Food Industries (SL) Limited March, 2023.





iii. Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and IMS GROUP (SL) LIMITED December, 2022.

8. Government Motion by the Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation.

The Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, **Prof. David John Francis**, presented the Government Motion to the House and moved for its ratification with the following words as quoted:

"Be it resolved: That This Honourable House hereby ratifies the following agreements which were laid on the Table of the House on Tuesday 7th March, 2023."

- i. Agreement between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Government of Hungary on Economic and Technical Cooperation.
- ii. Agreement on the Establishment of a Joint Committee for Cooperation between the Government of the State of Qatar and the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone.
- iii. Agreement on Mutual Administrative Assistance for the Optimal Application of Customs Law, Repression, Investigation and Customs Violations between the Government of the State of Qatar and the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone.
- iv. Agreement between the Government of the State of Qatar and the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone Concerning the Regulation of the Employment of Sierra Leonean Workers in the State of Qatar.

Committee Stage: The House resolved itself into Committee of the Whole.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Prince Oviasuyi, pronounced that Parts 1 to 5; Clauses 1 to 29 and the Schedule stand part of the bill.

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, moved that Parts 1 to 5; Clauses 1 to 29 and the Schedule stand part of the bill.

Mr. Chairman proposed the question for debate.

The debate started, and some amendments were made.

Mr. Speaker stood down the House at 5:00 p.m.

The House resumed at 5:05 p.m.

Proceedings Continued.

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, again moved that Parts 1 to 5; Clauses 1 to 29 and the Schedule stand part of the bill as amended.

Mr. Chairman put the question for vote as quoted:

Report Stage:

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo, reported to the House that the bill entitled: "The Work Permit Act, 2023" had gone through Committee of the Whole House with some amendments made.

Third Reading:

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, moved that the bill be read the Third Time and passed into law.

Mr. Speaker put the question for vote as quoted:

"All those in favor, say Aye."

"All those against, say Nay."

Through collection of voices, Mr. Speaker declared that the Ayes had it.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Prince Oviasuyi, pronounced that the bill entitled: "The Work Permit Act, 2023" with the following long title: "Being an Act to repeal Part VI A of the Non-Citizens (Registration, Immigration and Expulsion) Act, 1965 (Act No. 14 of 1965), to provide for the regulation of the employment of non-citizens in Sierra Leone and to provide for other related matters." had been read the Third Time and passed into law.

B. The Overseas Employment and Migrant Workers Act, 2022 by the Minister of Labour and Social Security.

Committee Stage: The House resolved itself into Committee of the Whole.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Prince Oviasuyi, pronounced that Parts 1 to 8; Clauses 1 to 32 stand part of the bill.

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, moved that Parts 1 to 8; Clauses 1 to 32 stand part of the bill.





Mr. Chairman proposed the question for debate.

The debate started, and some amendments were made.

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, again moved that Parts 1 to 8; Clauses 1 to 32 stand part of the bill as amended.

Mr. Chairman put the question for vote as quoted:

"All those in favor, say Aye."

"All those against, say Nay."

Through collection of voices, Mr. Chairman declared that the Ayes had it.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Price Oviasuyi, pronounced that Parts 1 to 8; Clauses 1 to 32 had formed part of the bill as amended.

The House resumed from the Committee Stage.

Report Stage:

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo, reported to the House that the bill entitled: "The Overseas Employment and Migrant Workers Act, 2023" had gone through Committee of the Whole House with some amendments made.

Third Reading:

The Minister of Labour and Social Security, **Mr. Alpha Osman Timbo**, moved that the bill be read the Third Time and passed into law.

Mr. Speaker put the question for vote as quoted:

"All those in favor, say Aye."

"All those against, say Nay."

Through collection of voices, Mr. Speaker declared that the Ayes had it.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Prince Oviasuyi, pronounced that the bill entitled: "The Overseas Employment and Migrant Workers Act, 2023" with the following long title: "Being an Act to provide for the regulation of overseas employment, to provide for the protection of the rights and welfare of migrant workers and members of their families and to provide for other related matters." had been read the Third Time and passed into law.
