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Pronouncement of Quorum at 10:18 am:

The Acting Clerk of Parliament, Mr. Gilbert Bosco N'habay, made the following pronouncement as quoted: "Mr. Speaker, Hon. Members. Pursuant to Section 89 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991 (Act No. 6 of 1991) in tandem with S.O. 7(1) of the Standing Orders of Parliament, this House has formed a quorum to commence its proceedings."

- 1. Prayers were read by Mrs. Fatmata Bintu Weston (Deputy Director II of Legislative Services).
- 2. Suspension of Standing Order 5 (2):

The motion for the suspension of SO 5 (2) at 10:18 am was moved by **Hon. Veronica K. Sesay from Moyamba District.** The motion was seconded by **Hon. Nenneh Lebbie from Bo District** and approved by the House.

4. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, Segepoh Solomon Thomas heartily welcomed Hon. Members from the A.P.C. back to the Chamber after they unequivocally expressed dissatisfaction with regards certain conducts of the Clerk of Parliament, which prompted them to dissociate themselves with any parliamentary sitting until an action was taken.

9. Standing Order 23 (Personal Explanations)

1. Hon. Hindolo Moiwo Gevao from Kailahun District rose S.O. 23, and with a heavy heart announced the death of his son who was brutally murdered allegedly at Beckles Lane Brookfield.





He stated that it was reported to him that his son's murder was the third at the same house. He further stated that someone wrote on Sierraloaded as quoted "You go wan make nasty say because e daddy ma Member of Parliament, na den dae na power". He informed the House that the Inspector General of Police was working on the matter and some arrests had been made. He sadly stated that the remains of his son had been laid to rest the previous day where a cross section of Members of Parliament attended the funeral. He also informed the House that he was informed by the Head of Cyber that a new incident had occurred (gruesome murder) at Goderich where two people were killed, and that two days ago a fulah woman was also killed at Mambo. He reminded the House about past incidents and said that a lot of incidents of that nature had occurred. He pleaded for the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Leaders of Parliament to look into murder cases and ensure that something must be done to stop such incidents to prevent further killing of people. He concluded by sharing the medical report of his deceased son to the House which stated broken skull, shocked with taser on the neck, all ribs broken, damaged liver, kidney splint etc. He thanked all those who stood with him during the difficult time.

Hon. Abdul Kargbo extended his heartfelt sympathy to Hon. Hindolo Moiwo Gevao from Kailahun District for the loss of his son. He pleaded with Mr. Speaker to ensure the safety of Members of Parliament and their families because while Members make laws, people easily took offence.

Response by Mr. Speaker

Mr. Speaker extended his commiserations to **Hon. Hindolo Moiwo Gevao from Kailahun District** for the loss of his son and stated that himself and most Hon. Members were oblivious about the sad event. He instructed the Acting Clerk of Parliament to invite the Inspector General of Police and Hon. **Hindolo Moiwo Gevao** to have a meeting with the Leadership of Parliament on Monday 7th July at 1:00 p.m.

2. Hon. Juliana Aliematu Fatorma informed the House that she woke up one Sunday morning with soldiers at her house ravaging her things where so many valuable things went missing. She said that she was left under the rains and the police stated that they had started with the Honourable Member as a deterrent (for the community to be afraid). She stated that such incidents were worrisome and she called on the intervention of the Speaker.

Hon. Abdul Kargbo from Port Loko District suggested the creation of a WhatsApp group for Members of Parliament. He stated that such group used to exist during the Fourth and Fifth Parliament. He also reminded the House that the provision of the Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991 did not allow Members of Parliament to be molested and treated as such. It protected Hon. Members and even if a member does something that warranted his/her arrest the police must first get approval from the Speaker to proceed.





- **3. Hon. Aaron A. Sesay from Tonkolili District** reported that two weeks ago he watched a podcast by the office of National Security (O.N.S.) upon which they issued a deadline that effective 31st August checkpoints would be mounted across the country in search of national identity cards, thereby making it possession mandatory. He cited s 18 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991, Act No. 6 of 1991 which states that the right to freedom of movement is a fundamental right for every Sierra Leonean. He stated that the aforesaid section could only be silent when the President invoked a state of public emergency in the case of a pandemic. He mentioned that s 15 of the National Civil Registration Authority (NCRA) Act was clear. The Act mandated the authority to create offices which should be permanent and functional in chiefdoms, district and national level. He also stated that as he spoke 80 to 90 % of the Chiefdoms NCRA had not set up offices to ensure that ID cards were issued to the people. He called upon the Speaker and said that in an attempt to make the possession of national ID cards mandatory, it would be a breach of the Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991, Act No. 6 of 1991. He emphasized on the need to relevant authorities such as the I.G. of Police, the Head of O.N.S. and the Head of NCRA to ensure that they put a hold to the announcement they just passed.
- **4. Hon. Rugiatu Tarawalli-Mustapha from Kenema District** also reported to the House that she had also been a victim where most of her valuable properties were destroyed. She stated that the incident occurred in the town she was born. She emphasized the need for something to be done to protect Hon. Members from such dangerous situations.
- **5. Hon. Shiaka Musa Sama from Pujehun District** described and reported incidents that occurred both in 2020 and the other as recent as the previous day. He informed the House that in 2020 he was arrested as a Member of Parliament and was taken to the police station, handcuffed and forced to sit on the floor. He stated that he took 9 days at the CID, one month in custody, some weeks at Pademba Road and two years in court only to be set free. He reported that himself, his family and his supporters suffered during that period because there was an allegation against him and nobody called to hear is own side of the story. He also reported that he was going to see a doctor the previous day around Old Road Ferry Terminal and he had a confrontation with a drunken military personnel member who threatened to slap him.
- **6. Hon Abdul Kargbo from Port Loko District** drew the attention of the House to what people described as citizenship by investment. Meaning if someone was out of the jurisdiction of Sierra Leone, just by paying some amount of money they become citizens of Sierra Leone. He stated that he had seen a lot of videos and write-ups on citizen by investment. He said that he wanted to remind the House that anything regarding citizenship must be authorized by the Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991 and with the express approval of Parliament.





- 7. Hon. Amie Nyava Moriba from Bo District reported to the House that she saw a video on social media portraying a woman who pretended to be selling food at the school but instead she was caught selling kush to vulnerable pupils at the school. She wanted the incident to be conveyed to the Minister of Education as well as all School Principals for them to be aware and be watchful for the pupils. She also mentioned that the sale of tramadol should be monitored because even under aged children could buy the said drug over the counter. She said that certain drugs should not be sold without a prescription. She concluded by pleading for ID cards for the identification of Members of Parliament to prevent being embarrassed /harassed by the military or police personnel because they did not regard MP license plate.
- **8. Hon. Abduk Karim Kamara from Kambia District** reported that the road along ferry junction was always messy and its bridge was located close towards the 'Bormeh' waste dump. He said that some time ago the right-hand side of the bridge collapsed and caused a tragedy where lives were lost. He informed the House that the middle of the bridge was looking like a swamp with SLRA and cement factories very close but none of them seemed to care about the situation which was causing heavy traffic.
- 9. Hon. P.C. Alameen Kanneh from Kenema District advised that the House should be proactive because Members of Parliament pass laws almost every day and thereby, they become targets. He said that rigid security system should be set up and to increase alertness to potential threats to Members of Parliament. He stated that Members of Parliament could be a target to potential threat at both national and international level. He also suggested that Members of Parliament should be given financially supported for home security facility and proffer the idea to set up a committee to evaluate threats, assess their credibility and recommend protective measures. He said that Parliament should also try to develop and regularly update emergency response plans for various scenarios, including shooting situations, and establish clear communication protocols. Last but not the least, he proffered that Parliament should try to raise public awareness for the importance of respecting elected officials and the need to refrain from inflicting violence and intimidation upon them.

10. Adjournment:

Mr. Speaker adjourned the House to Thursday 10th July, 2025 at 10:00 a.m. The House rose at 12:30 p.m.
