3. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The following announcement was made by The Acting Speaker, Hon. Segepoh S. Thomas;

"Condolence Message by the Parliament of the Republic of Sierra Leone in Respect of the Wellington Fuel Tanker Disaster.

On Friday the 5th November, 2021 the Parliament of the Republic of Sierra Leone was stunned by the news of a devastating tragedy caused by the collusion and explosion of a fuel tanker at Wellington, Freetown in the Western Area of the Republic of Sierra Leone. The Considerable number of deaths and pain of fellow Sierra Leoneans as a sequel to that incident as seen all over the social media is too much for Parliament to bear.

As the nation mourns this misfortunate tragedy, we as a Parliament, send our heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families. We want you to know how sorry we are. May fond memories of your deceased loved ones bring you comfort during this hard time in your life. Our hearts and prayers go out to you and your families.

Please accept our condolences and may our prayers help comfort you and hasten the journey of the souls of the departed to heaven.

In addition to wishing full and speedy recovery to the injured, Parliament expresses its thanks and appreciation to His Excellency the President of the Republic of Sierra Leone, Brigadier (Rtd) Dr. Julius Maada Bio, the Hon. Vice President of the Republic of Sierra Leone Dr. Mohamed Juldeh Jalloh, our doctors and nurses of hospitals, the Police, Military, Fire Force and the National Disaster Management Agency and other Responders for their quick response and what they continue to do to provide comfort for the bereaved families and the injured.

As a nation, we have had our share of too many bad news. We pray at this moment that our God Almighty grant us His tender mercies now. Amen!!!"

The Deputy speaker, Hon. Segepoh S. Thomas further asked that the House stood up to observe a minute silence in memory of the departed at the Wellington fire incident.

He recited the prayer, "may the souls of the departed through the mercy of God rest in peace".





Observation:

The Leader of the Opposition, **Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban** reminded the House that he had challenged the capacity of Sierra Leone Road Safety Authority (SLRSA) on several occasions in the House. He said few days before the incident he had engaged the Chairman of Transport Committee and the Leader of Government business on similar issue. He requested through the Speakership that Parliament should summon the (SLRSA) so that they could sit down and chat the way forward and map out measures as to avoid such misfortunes.

The Acting Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082**, **Bo District** supported the Leader of the Opposition and further asked that the Police, Fire force and Internal Affairs be involved in the meeting.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Deputy speaker, **Hon. Segepoh S. Thomas** ordered that the meeting with all players involved should hold immediately, and that the report should be presented to the House within 2 weeks.

Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban District,** Informed the House that on Thursday 4th November, 2021 after accompanying the flag bearer of the APC Party to and from The Anti-Corruption Commission and on his way from the scene, a police officer directly shot tear gas on the wind screen of his vehicle which left it completely damaged. He said that the act by the police officer was an attempt on his life and the other passengers in his vehicle. He further requested that the Inspector General of Police be invited to Parliament to answer some questions as that was not the first time.

The Acting Leader of Government, **Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District** responded by empathizing with the Leader of the Opposition for the ordeal he went through and said that fortunately Parliament had earlier agreed to invite the Inspector General of Police. Therefore, they would seize the opportunity to look into the concern of their colleague and try to put a stop to such.





The Chairman on Internal Affairs, **Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District** also empathized with the Leader of Opposition and informed the House that the Internal Affairs Committee would invite the Inspector General of Police. He also asked that the Leadership of Parliament attend the meeting.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

Mr. Speaker assured the Leader of the Opposition that his complaint had been taken up by Committee on Internal Affairs and that the Leadership would be in attendance on the stated date of the said meeting.

The Acting Leader of Government, **Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District** reminded the House that the report from the Shuman's incident that was to be investigated by the appointed joint Committees should be presented to the House on Thursday 11th November, 2021.
