

1. Prayers were read by Mr. Alimamy Lincoln Bangura (Table Clerk).

2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2):

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 10:50 am was moved by **Hon. Brima Mansaray of Constituency 017, Kenema District.** The motion seconded by **Hon. Hindolo Tennyson Sandy of Constituency 120, Western Urban District** and approved by the House.

3. Adoption of Record of Votes and Proceedings for 22ND November, 2022:

The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Tuesday 22ND November, 2022 was moved by **Hon. Hindolo Tennyson Sandy of Constituency 120, Western Urban District**, it was seconded by **Hon. Rosaline Hawa Siafa of Constituency 005, Kailahun District** and approved by the House.

4. Laying of Papers:

The Table Clerk, **Alimamy Lincoln Bangura**, called upon The Attorney-General and Minister of Justice to lay the papers that were itemized on the Order Paper.

Observation by The Acting Leader of Opposition:

The Whip of Opposition who doubled as The Acting Leader of Opposition, Hon. Hassan A. Sesay of Constituency 050, Tonkolili District said that they as Hon. Members of the main Opposition were not expecting the the Statutory Instruments that were about to be laid on the Table of the House to be put on the Order Paper for that day's sitting because there had been an agreeable understanding between the Leader of Opposition and Leader of Government Business for the said documents to be laid on Thursday 24th November 2022. He also said that the two Statutory Instruments were referring to provisions of the 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone. He finally said that it was not in the best interest of the state for the said documents to be laid on the Table of the House because it would undermine some provisions in the 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone which is the grundnorm.

Hon. Alpha Amadu Bah drew the attention of the House to the following Statutory Instruments: "The Public Elections (Local Councils Proportional Representation System) Regulations, 2022" and "The Public Elections (District Block Proportional Representation System) Regulations, 2022." He said that as Statutory Instruments, they were in the House as subsidiary legislations, and that they were to give effects to their parent acts, and they should not refer to the Constitution. He stated that based on his humble view, the said papers were not properly before the House, and that they should not be laid on the Table of the House.





Response by The Leader of Government Business:

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma, said that Hon. Members should be bound by law to obey legislation passed by Parliament. He reminded the House about the composition of the Business Committee and clarified that the Order Paper for that day's sitting was sent to every Member of the Business Committee way ahead of that day's sitting as there were records to the effect. He also clarified that the distribution of the two Statutory Instruments to Hon. Members took place on Monday 21st November 2022 and not on Tuesday 22nd November 2022 as said by Hon. Members of the Opposition. He referred the House to Section 33 of the 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone and recited the following provision as quoted: "Subject to the provisions of the Constitution, the Electoral Commission shall be responsible for the conduct and supervision of the registration of voters for, and of, all public elections and referenda; and for that purpose shall have power to make regulations by statutory instrument for the registration of voters, the conduct of Presidential, Parliamentary or Local Government elections and referenda, and other matters connected therewith, including regulations for voting by proxy." He encouraged Hon. Members of the Opposition to recourse to the Supreme Court for any grievances of theirs concerning any constitutional interpretation.

He also referred the House to Section 171 of "The Public Elections Act, 2022" as well as Section 38 (a) of The 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone and read the said provisions.

He finally referred the House to **Section 56 of "The Public Elections Act, 2022."** He further encouraged Hon. Members of the Opposition to follow procedures and not to bring rancour in the House.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

He said that he was truly amazed by the submissions made from both sides signifying nothing. He said that the submissions made by the Acting Leader of Opposition and the Leader of Government Business was like putting the cart before the horse. He asked that the House proceeded with the items on the Order Paper.

During the process of laying the papers, there was rancour in the House, and the proceedings of the House was put to a halt at 11:00 a.m.

The House resumed at 12:00 p.m.

5. Suspension of Standing Order at 12 Noon:

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 12:00 pm was moved by Hon. Mohamed Kanneh of Constituency 006, Kailahun District for the Proceedings to continue during lunch. The motion was seconded by Hon. Alieu Ibrahim Kamara of Constituency 122, Western Urban District and approved by the House.

Hon. Members of the Opposition were still standing in the chamber and refusing to take their allotted seats.





The Leader of The Coalition for Change (C4C) in Parliament, **Hon. Saa Emerson Lamina**, said that due to the situation in the chamber, the dignity of Parliament was at stake in accordance with Section 97 of The 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone.

The Deputy Speaker, **Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas**, rose on a point of order and urged Mr. Speaker to invoke S.O. 43 (3) so that order and decorum could be maintained in the chamber.

The Clerk of Parliament as well as the Chief Adviser to the Speaker, **Hon. Paran Umar Tarawally**, made an announcement that all Hon. Members should take their allotted seats for order and decorum to be maintained in the chamber so that the House would continue with the proceedings of that day's sitting.

When Hon. Members of the Opposition were refusing to take their allotted seats, and in order to restore order and decorum in the chamber so that the proceedings of the House would continue, The Clerk of Parliament, **Hon. Paran Umar Tarawally**, ordered the Sierra Leone Police to take over the security of the chamber.

Continued Proceedings:

Papers laid by the Deputy Attorney--General and Minister of Justice:

The Deputy Attorney--General and Minister of Justice, **Umar Napoleon Koroma Esq**, laid the following papers that were itemized on the Order Paper:

a. The Public Elections (Local Councils Proportional Representation System) Regulations, 2022.

The Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991 (Act No. 6 of 1991)

Statutory Instrument No. 13.

b. The Public Elections (District Block Proportional Representation System) Regulations, 2022.

The Constitution of Sierra Leone 1991 (Act No. 6 of 1991)

Statutory Instrument No. 14.

Standing Order 25:

After the said documents had been laid, **Hon. Musa Fofanah of Constituency 023, Kono District** rose on S.O. 25 and gave a notice of motion for the said documents to be debated. He informed the House that he would do the needful in relating to drafting the motion.





6. Amendment of Order Paper:

The Leader of Government Business (Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma) moved a motion to amend the Order Paper by incorporating the Seventh Report of the Legislative Committee within item "V" of the Order Paper that dealt with the bill entitled: "The Local Government Act, 2021." The motion was seconded by the Deputy Leader of Government Business (Hon. Bashiru Silikie) and approved by the House.

7. Suspension of Standing Order at 3:00 p.m.

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 3:00 pm was moved by Hon. Mohamed Kanneh of Constituency 006, Kailahun District for the Proceedings to continue after 3 p.m. The motion was seconded by Hon. Josephine Makieu of Constituency 014, Kenema District and approved by the House.

8. Bill: The Local Government Act, 2021 by The Minister of Local Government and Rural Development:

Committee Stage: The House resolved itself into Committee of the Whole.

Presentation of Report:

The Chairman of the Legislative Committee, Hon. Abdul S. Marray Conteh of Constituency 130, Western Urban District, presented the Seventh Report of the Fifth Session of the Fifth Parliament of the Legislative Committee on the bill entitled: "The Local Government Act, 2021."

The Table Clerk, Mr. Prince Oviasuyi, pronounced that Parts 1 to 6; Clauses 1 to 46 stand part of the bill.

The Minister of Local Government, **Mr. Tamba Lamina**, moved that Parts 1 to 6; Clauses 1 to 46 stand part of the bill.

Mr. Chairman proposed the question for debate.

The debate started, and some amendments were made.

The Minister of Local Government, **Mr. Tamba Lamina**, again moved that Parts 1 to 6; Clauses 1 to 46 stand part of the bill as amended.





Mr. Chairman put the question for vote.

"All those in favor, say Aye."

"All those against, say Nay."

Through collection of voices, Mr. Chairman declared that the Ayes had it.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Price Oviasuyi, pronounced that Parts 1 to 6; Clauses 1 to 46 had formed part of the bill as amended.

The House resumed from the Committee Stage.

Adjournment:

Mr. Speaker adjourned the House to Thursday 24th November, 2022. The House rose at 4:00 p.m.
