- 1. Prayers were read by Mr. Ismaila Kabba (Table Clerk).
- 2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2) at 10:20 a.m.

The motion for the suspension of S. O. 5 (2) at 10:20 a.m. was moved by **Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District** for the commencement of proceedings. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Jebbeh Alice Kumabeh of Constituency 092, Bonthe District** and approved by the House.

3. Adoption of Record of Votes and Proceedings for Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2021:

The motion for the adoption of Record of Votes and Proceedings for **Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> February, 2021** was moved by **Hon. Simeon Fefegula of Constituency 096, Moyamba District.** It was seconded by **Hon. Massay Ngahinteh Aruna of Constituency 085, Bo District** and adopted by the House.

### 4. Laying of Paper:

The Table Clerk, **Mr. Ismaila Kabba**, called upon the Leader of Government Business to lay the Paper that was itemized on the Order Paper.

Paper laid by the Leader of Government Business.

The Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019**, **Kenema District** laid the following paper:

### The Chief Whip of Opposition:

The Chief Whip of Opposition, Hon. Hassan A. Sesay of Constituency 050, Tonkolili District, rose on S.O. 34 (Points of Order). He said that when good deeds had been done, the people that had done the deeds should be appreciated. He referred the House to Section 118, Sub-section 7 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone (Act No. 6 of 1991). He said that the said section did not discriminate on which kind of gifts should be brought to Parliament. He informed the House that a fleet of vehicles was donated to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of which the House of Parliament was not informed. He also talked about the rice that was donated by the Government of China to the Ministry of Basic Education in 2020, which was not brought to the House of Parliament.

### Response from the Leader of Government Business:

The Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District,** responded that there were procedures to be followed.

### The Chief Whip of Government Business:

The Chief Whip of Government Business, Hon. Dickson M. Rogers of Constituency 100, Pujehun District, agreed with Hon. Hassan A. Sesay. He said that the procedures should be followed.

### The Acting Speaker's Response:

The Acting Speaker, Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, said that he totally agreed with Hon. Hassan A. Sesay on his point made and ordered that those gifts and especially the fleet of vehicles given to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation should be brought to the House for Parliamentary approval.





### The Deputy Leader of Government Business:

The Deputy Leader of Government Business, Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District, also supported the concern raised by Hon. Hassan A. Sesay.

### The Leader of Government Business

The Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District** informed the House that there had been a Memoradum of Understanding between the House of Parliament and all Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs).

5. Bill: The Medical Examiners Act, 2020 by The Minister of Internal Affairs.

The Table Clerk, **Mr. Ismaila Kabba**, called upon The Minister of Internal Affairs to proceed on the Committee Stage and Third Reading of the bill.

### **Committee Stage:**

The Table Clerk, Mr. Ismaila Kabba called upon the Chairman of the Legislative Committee to do a presentation on the bill.

### **Presentation of Report:**

The Chairman of the Legislative Committee, Hon. Abdul S. Marray Conteh of Constituency 130, Western Urban District, presented the Fifth Report of the Third Session of the Fifth Parliament of the Legislative Committee on the bill entitled "The Medical Examiners Act, 2020."

### The Acting Speaker's Announcement:

The Acting Speaker, Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, informed the House that they could not proceed with the bill because the well was not comfortable for Hon. Members of Parliament. He informed the House that he would adjourn the sitting to Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> February 2021 against which the Administration of Parliament would have ensured that the Well of Parliament would be extremely comfortable for Hon. Members of Parliament.

### 6. Standing Order 23 (Personal Explanations):

The following Hon. Members stood on S.O.23:

(i) Hon. Daniel B. Koroma of Constituency 046, Koinadugu District informed the House that Parliament needed to keep to its standards regarding the pandemic surrounding them (Covid 19 and Ebola Diseases). He told the House that at the beginning of the Corona Pandemic, Parliament was so proactive





by inviting the Minister of Internal Affairs together with the Minister of Health and Sanitation to explain to the people about how prepared the state was. He suggested that Parliament should keep to its standard by further inviting the relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) to tell the people of the country through their elected representatives about the state of preparedness.

### **Response by the Leader of Government Business**

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District thanked Hon. Daniel B. Koroma for his concerns raised. He informed the House that The Minister of Health and Sanitation (Dr. Austin Demby) together with the Substantive Speaker of Parliament (Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu) had gone to the Republic of Guinea concerning the Yenga and Ebola Crisis. He said that when the Minister of Health and Sanitation returned from the Republic of Guinea, he would be invited to the House for further explanation about the state of preparedness

### The Acting Speaker's Response

The Acting Speaker, Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, ordered that the Key operatives (The NaCOVERC Coordinator, the Minister of Internal Affairs and the Minister of Health and Sanitation) be invited to the House to explain to Hon. Members of Parliament about the state of preparedness as a nation.

(ii) The Leader of the National Grand Coalition (NGC), Hon. Dr. Kandeh Kolleh Yumkella of Constituency 062, Kambia District informed the House about a major fire disaster in his constituency at Yeliboya. He also talked about the alleged allocations of funding to different institutions in the Office of the President. He referred the House to Section 93, Sub-sections (2), (3) and (6).

### Response by the Leader of Government Business:

The Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District,** informed Hon. Members that the House of Parliament deliberates on factual issues and not allegations. He said that he had respect for the views of **Hon. Dr. Kandeh Kolleh Yumkella** but insisted that the House of Parliament deals with facts because it is a credible institution.





- (iii) **Hon. Alice Jebbeh Kumabeh of Constituency 092, Bonthe District** informed the House about the contamination of the water along the Taia River which greatly affected her people due to some mining activities taking place on an unknown location. She told the House that there had also been an outbreak of Diarrhea. She craved the indulgence of the House for a very speedy intervention.
- (iv) **Hon. P.C. Alie Badara Sheriff of** also informed the House about the pollution of the Taia River. He told the House that the Gold Mining Company was responsible for the pollution of the Taia River.
- (v) The Leader of Opposition, Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban District suggested that a Special Committee should be instituted including representatives of the relevant Select Committees.
- (vi) Hon. Alice Jebbeh Kumabeh of Constituency 092, Bonthe District moved that a Special Select Committee comprising Hon. Members of the Parliamentary Committees on Mines and Mineral Resources, Environment, Defence and Water Resources conduct hearing on reasons behind the contamination of the Taia River and report to the House. The motion was seconded by Hon. P.C. Alie Badara Sheriff of Bonthe District and approved by the House.
- (vii) Hon. Abdul Karim Kamara of Constituency of Constituency 059, Kambia District informed the House about the reform of rankings in the Sierra Leone Police during the administration of the Late President Ahmed Tejan Kabba. He also talked about the difficulties surrounding transportation and the involvement of the Sierra Leone Road Transport Corporation.
- (viii) **Hon. Mohamed Billoh Shaw of Constituency 039, Falaba Distict** informed the House about his intention to plead to NaCOVERC to shift the time of curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 12:00 p.m.

### The Acting Speaker's Response

The Acting Speaker, Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, ordered that The Committee of Transport and Aviation looked into the issue of transportation and the involvement of the Sierra Leone Road Transport Corporation (SLRTC).

**Hon. Foday Mario Kamara of Constituency 057, Kambia District** talked about the timing of the curfew and the issue of Arm Robbery and Burglary.





Hon. Osman Charles Abdulai of Constituency 079, Bo District informed the House that his Paramount Chief had fallen ill on the 5<sup>th</sup> of February 2021. He told the House that they had been mandated by their ancestors to seek ancestral healing journey which would be on the 14<sup>th</sup> of March 2021.

### 7. Standing Order 16 (Business Statement):

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S.Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District announced the list of business items on the Internal Notice Paper that would be possibly considered on the next adjourned date as mentioned below:
