1. Prayers were read by Mrs. Fatmata Bintu Weston (Senior Table Clerk).

2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2) at 10:25 a.m.

The motion for the suspension of S. O. 5 (2) at 10:25 a.m. was moved by **Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District** for the commencement of proceedings. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Alice Jebbeh Kumabeh of Constituency 092, Bonthe District** and approved by the House.

3. Amendment of Order Paper:

The Acting Leader of Government Business, Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District moved a motion to amend the Order Paper by expunging item V from the Order Paper, and the initial item VI then became item V with the words "Addendum to" added to the phrase Sessional Select Committees. He also moved for a new item VI to be accommodated and read as "Private Member's Motion," and The bill entitled The Anti-Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling Act, 2021 became item VII. The motion was seconded by Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District and approved by the House.

Mr. Speaker's Observation:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu** directed that any Ministry which failed to appear before the House to move instruments that were related to them would have itself to be blame because all that concerned the said ministry would not be considered for the rest of the session, and those instruments would be moved to the next session.

He gave that directive upon the failure of the Minister of Tourism and Cultural Affairs and his Deputy Minister to appear before the House to move a number of instruments that were on the Order Paper for that day.

4. The Adoption of The Record of Votes and Proceedings for Tuesday 12th April, 2022:

The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Tuesday 12th April, 2022 was moved by **Hon. Sahr Charles of Constituency 028, Kono District**. It was seconded by **Hon. Brima Mansaray of Constituency 017, Kenema District** and adopted by the House.

5. Announcement by Mr. Speaker:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu** informed the House that Parliament had a number of events lined up; first among was the 2nd Open Day of Parliament which was scheduled to take place from the 5th- 7th May 2022. He said the idea for the Open Day was to promote the culture of openness through access and information sharing with the Citizenry, Development Partners, Academia, Civil Societies etc. for better understanding of what Parliament was about. He also said the President of the Republic of Sierra Leone, **Rtd. Brigadier Julius Maada Bio** had graciously consented that he would be in attendance to do the formal opening of the Open Day of Parliament.





Mr. Speaker also reminded Hon. Members that the Fourth Session of Parliament would end on the 9th May 2022 and the Fifth Session would commence on the 10th May 2022 which would last until the dissolution of Parliament. He said that the Fifth Session would conclude the life of Parliament. He then wished all Hon. Members well as they would be seeking a new mandate from their constituents.

Mr. Speaker announced that the African Region of the Common Wealth Parliament (CPA) was kind enough to elect him as President, and they had requested that the Sierra Leone Parliament should play host for the 52nd CPA Regional Assembly. He informed the House that the event would take place from the 3rd-9th June 2022. He said the Parliament of Sierra Leone would be expecting over 500 delegates, and he would need the cooperation and support of all Hon. Members to take ownership of the events as their roles would be clearly defined as the event unfolded. He suggested that the Leadership should meet immediately after that day's sitting in his chamber and further stated that the whole House would meet in Committee Room 1, on Monday 25th April 2022 to discuss and plan well for the success of the conference.

Mr. Speaker in his last announcement informed all Hon. Members about the new system he was about to adopt. He said that a list of MPs who were on time for that day's sitting would be prepared and would be given priority to catch his eyes if they wanted to make a contribution.

8. Bill: The Anti-Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling Act, 2021 by the Minister of Social Welfare.

The Table Clerk, Mr. Francis Ernest Farma, called upon the Minister of Social Welfare to proceed on the Introduction and First Reading of the bill.

(i) Introduction and First Reading:

The Minister of Social Welfare, Mrs. Baindu Dassama-Kamara, moved that the bill entitled "The Anti-Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling Act, 2021" be read the First Time.

Mr. Speaker put the question for vote.

Standing Order 51 - (Committal of Bills):

The Acting Leader of Government Business (Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District) rose on S.O. 51 and moved a motion for the bill entitled: "The Anti-Human Trafficking and Migrant Smuggling Act, 2021" to be committed to the Legislative Committee for further scrutiny. The motion was seconded by the Acting Leader of Opposition Hon. Hassan A. Sesay of Constituency 050, Tonkolili District and approved by the House.

9. Standing Order 23 – (Personal Explanations):

The following Hon. Members stood on S.O. 23:

- (i) Hon. Lahai Marah of Constituency 042, Falaba District informed the House about a cross border conflict that had led to the death of a man in his constituency with regards cattle rearing. He said after the report of a missing cattle, a man was caught with a cattle and shot dead. Since then, the situation had escalated to the burning of houses. He said there had been gun men with unauthorized guns causing mayhem in the villages. He sympathized with the affected people and pleaded for the police to address the issue before it turned into a tribal war. He requested that the Speaker should use his good office to call upon the police to address the issue between Falaba and Kono Districts.
- (ii) Hon. Alieu Ibrahim Kamara of Constituency 122, Western Urban informed the House about the huge piles of garbage in the Mo wharf Community that were disposed in the main drainage emptying into the Atlantic Ocean. He said that the people in the aforementioned community had been suffering from that garbage disposed by surrounding Communities. He stated that five households had already been destroyed due to the said problem. He said that he had had engagements with institutions responsible for disaster management like the Office of National Security (ONS), Freetown City Council (FCC) etc. He stated that the said issue would lead to a dreadful disaster if the problem would not be addressed within the shortest possible time.

Adjournment:

Mr. Speaker adjourned the House to Tuesday 25th April 2022 at 10:00 a.m. The House rose at 1:40 p.m.
