- 1. Prayers were read by Mrs. Fatmata Bintu Weston (Table Clerk).
- 2. The Adoption of The Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 20th January, 2022:
 The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 20th January, 2022 was moved by Hon. Allieu Ibrahim Kamara of Constituency 122, Western Urban District. It was seconded by Hon. Joseph Williams-Lamin of Constituency 081, Bo District and adopted by the House.

3. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, informed the House about laying-out ceremony for the Late **Hon. Aloysious Bockarie Ansumana of Constituency 005**, **Kailahun District** immediately after adjournment at the State Hall of Parliament. He said that the Laying-out ceremony would hopefully start at 2:00 p.m. He reminded all Hon. Members that the laying-out ceremony was theirs, and that they required no invitation to attend. He encouraged all Hon. Members to invite the rest of mankind to join in paying their last respects to the late Hon. Member.

Standing Order 26 (Privilege Motion)

Hon. Daniel B. Koroma of Constituency 046, Koinadugu District rose on standing Order 26 and moved a motion for that day's proceeding to be suspended so that they would meet in camera and address some burning issues that had been affecting them as Hon. Members, The Speakership, The Leadership, and The Clerk of Parliament.

The Leader of Government Business, **Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District** pleaded with Hon. Members of the House to continue with the proceedings of that day's sitting. He assured Hon. Members that they would proceed to Committee Room 1 to discuss those issues immediately after the laying-out ceremony of the late **Hon. Aloysious Bockarie Ansumana.**

The Leader of Opposition, **Hon. Chernor R.M.Bah of Constituency 126, Western urban District** joined the leader of Government Business to continue to plead with Hon. Members of the House to allow the proceedings to progress undisruptively. He said he believed that the issues raised by **Hon. Daniel B. Koroma** with the total support of other Hon. Members under S.O. 26 would be addressed in camera after the laying-out ceremony. He made mentioned of the Parliamentary Service Commission (PSC) and said that he was surprised that the Clerk of Parliament had not engaged them up to then.





Mr. Speaker's Response:

Members to proceed on that understanding.
