- 1. Prayers were read by Mr. Francis Ernest Farma (Table Clerk).
- 2. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2):

The suspension of S.O. 5(2) at 10:30 a.m. was moved by **Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District** for the commencement of Proceedings. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Mohamed Kanneh of Constituency 006, Kailahun District** and approved by the House.

3. Adoption of The Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 4th February, 2021:

The motion for the adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 4th February, 2021 was moved by Hon. Moses B. Jorkie of Constituency 091, Bonthe District. It was seconded by Hon. Moses Andrew Edwin of Constituency 090, Bonthe District and adopted by the House with an amendment.

Mr. Speaker stood down the House at 10:35 a.m. The House resumed at 10:50 a.m.

4. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, referred the House to page 8 of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Thursday 4th February 2021 and informed the House about the issue that was raised by the Deputy Speaker concerning the appointments of the personnel of local courts particularly the Chairman and Vice Chairman. He told the House that he had been in consultation with the Minister of Local Government and Rural Development (**Mr. Tamba Lamina**) together with the Attorney-General and Minister of Justice (**Anthony Y. Brewah Esq.**) on the said matter, and that the Minister of Local Government and Rural Development had sought the assistance of Parliament. He told the House that a Select Committee would be constituted to assist the Ministry of Local Government and Rural Development in that process. He said that he would wish to draw on the experience of Hon. Members in matters relating to the administration of local government.

5. Laying of Papers: The Table Clerk, Mr. Francis Ernest Farma, called upon the Minister of Finance to lay the Papers that were itemized on the Order Paper.

The Leader of Opposition:

The Leader of Opposition, Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban District, rose on S.O. 34 (Points of Order) and indulged the patience of Mr. Speaker. He reminded Mr. Speaker that they had requested during a previous sitting for the presence of the Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources and Mr. Speaker had also ordered the attendance of the said minister (Mr. Musa Timothy Kabba) to talk to the House about the issue of Kingho Mining Company Ltd. He said that since he had been exercising





patience on the said issue, the Ministry was in a press conference attempting to respond to questions that were supposed to be answered in the House. He kindly pleaded to Mr. Speaker to ensure the presence of the said Minister on the next adjourned date.

The Leader of Government Business:

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District, told the House that the Business of modern-day democracy was not business as usual under the New Direction Administration. He said that they wanted to uphold the proper parliamentary procedures. He informed the House that the Chairman of the Committee on Mines and Mineral Resources pleaded to him for the issue to be firstly dealt with in the Committee Stage before it would be sent to the plenary. He told Mr. Speaker that on the next sitting, they would agree when they would handle the matter through the proper parliamentary procedures.

Saa Emerson Lamina of Constituency 030, Kono District, informed the House that the Committee Clerk had been charged to summon the Minister of Mines and Mineral Resources to appear before the Committee on Thursday 11th of February 2021 at 2:00 p.m. He assured the House that the said Minister had been summoned to appear before the Committee on Mines and Mineral Resources on Thursday 11th of February 2021 at 2:00 p.m.

8. Bill: The Medical Examiners Act, 2020 by The Minister of Internal Affairs.

The Table Clerk, **Mr. Francis Ernest Farma**, called upon The Minister of Internal Affairs to do the **Second Reading** of the bill.

Second Reading:

The Deputy Minister of the Ministry of Internal Affairs, Mr. Lahai Lawrence Leema, moved that the bill entitled "The Medical Examiners Act, 2020" be read the <u>Second Time</u>. He presented the objects and reasons of the bill to the House and again moved that the bill be read the <u>Second Time</u>.

9. Standing Order 16 (Business Statement):

The Acting Leader of Government Business, Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District announced the list of business items on the Internal Notice Paper that would be possibly considered on the next adjourned date as mentioned below:

- 10. Standing Order 23 (Personal Explanations):

The following Hon. Members stood on S.O.23:

(i) The Chief Whip of Opposition, Hon. Hassan A. Sesay of Constituency 050, Tonkolili District, reminded the House about an issue that he raised some time ago to summon the Governor of the Bank of Sierra Leone. He told the House that Mr. Speaker had promised that the other issues raised by Hon. Members would be incorporated for the Governor's answer. He drew the attention of the stakeholders that they should be prepared to respond to those issues that were raised by Hon. Members.

The Acting Leader of Government Business, Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District responded to the issue raised by the Chief Whip of Opposition. He assured the House that they would definitely summon the Governor of the Bank of Sierra Leone.





- (ii) **Hon. Abdul Karim Kamara of Constituency 059, Kambia District** informed the House about the series of riots across the country. He made mention of the incident in Makeni upon which report had not been tabled. He also talked about the **Tombo** and **Pademba Road** incidents. He asked to call upon the Committee on Internal Affairs to ask the relevant stakeholders to present reports to the House. He also reminded the House about issues in the House that he believed the Leadership should look into.
 - The Acting Leader of Government Business, Hon. Bashiru Silikie of Constituency 082, Bo District responded to the second issue raised by Hon. Abdul Karim Kamara relating to the tabling of reports when assignments had been given to the Chairmen of Select Committees.
- (iii) **Hon. Saa Emerson Lamina of Constituency, Kono District** informed the House about the ad hoc Committee of nine that was set up in 2019 to investigate reasons for the many violent incidents across the country. He reminded the House about the motion that was moved by the Chief Whip of Opposition and seconded by the Chief Whip of Government Business.
- (iv) Hon. Abdul Karim Kamara of Constituency 059, Kambia District responded to the issues raised by Hon.

 Saa Emerson Lamina to clarify his points earlier made. He further asked for the reports for both the

 Tombo and Pademba Road incidents.
- (v) **Hon. Dr. Mark Mamoud Kalokoh of Constituency 032, Bombali District** informed the House about the incident that happened at Jui involving the total destruction of stores and shops along the high way at Jui Junction. He said he would not question the action, but he would question the procedures. He asked that the House instituted an investigation on the procedures and timing.
- (vi) **Hon. Mustapha Musa Sellu of Constituency 095, Moyamba District** asked that controversial issues should not be made under Standing Order 23 (Personal Explanations).





Response by the Acting Speaker:

The Acting Speaker, Hon Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, asked that the Chairman of the Local Government Committee conducted some forms of investigation into the said matter.
