- 1. Mr. Speaker (Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu) was in his seat at 10:00 a.m.
- 2. Prayers were read by Mr. Francis Ernest Farma (Table Clerk).

3. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2):

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5 (2) at 10:30 a.m. was moved by the Deputy Chief Whip of Government Business, Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District for the commencement of proceedings. The motion was seconded by Hon. Mohamed Kanneh of Constituency 006, Kailahun District and approved by the House.

4. Amendment of Order Paper:

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District moved a motion to amend the Order Paper by changing the figure of US\$ 40M to US\$ 25M concerning the Loan Agreement for the Construction of Tikonko-Kpetema-Mattru Jong Road Project — Lot 1: Kpetema-Mattru Jong between Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA). The motion was seconded by Hon. Joseph Williams-Lamin of Constituency 081, Bo District and approved by the House.

5. Adoption of the Record of Votes and Proceedings for Tuesday 20th June, 2021:

The motion for the adoption of Record of Votes and Proceedings for **Tuesday 20**th **June, 2021** was moved by **Hon. Moses B. Jorkie of Constituency 091, Bonthe District.** It was seconded by **Hon. Simeon Fefegula of Constituency 096, Moyamba District** and adopted by the House with an amendment.

6. Mr. Speaker's Announcement:

The Rt. Hon Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, informed the House that it had been brought to his attention that the "Title" (**Honourable**) had been arrogated by various people of which some were entitled but most were not entitled. He said that the source of the confusion was based on a provision of the 1978 Constitution of Sierra Leone that mandatorily stated as quoted "You cannot been appointed a Minister unless you were a Member of Parliament." He, further, stated as quoted that "Under the 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone, the separation of powers was absolutely made clear of which 'You cannot be a Member of Parliament and a Minister at the same time'." He declared that he would hopefully make a <u>ruling</u> on the said issue on the next sitting to clearly indicate those that were entitled to the "Epithet" – **Honourable** and those that were not entitled.

7. (A) Government Motion by the Minister of Finance:

"Be it resolved: that this Honourable House hereby ratifies the following Agreements which were laid on the Table of the House on Monday 10th May, 2021."





- (i) Amendment to the Financing Agreement between the International Fund for Agricultural Development and the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone in Respect of the Agricultural Value Chain Development Project.
- (ii)Letter of Agreement Transition Support Facility (TSF) Enhancing Efficiency and Sustainability of Artisanal and Small-Scale Mining through Climate Smart Actions between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the African Development Fund.
- (iii) Supplemental Agreement to the Loan Agreement Signed on 12/05/1433H (04/04/2012G) between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Islamic Development Bank (ISDB) Concerning the Construction of the Pendembu-Kailahun Road Project in the Amount of US\$ 10,000,000.
- (iv) Financing Agreement on the Freetown Wash and Aquatic Environment Revamping Project between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Islamic Development Bank Comprising the Following:
 - (a) Agency Agreement (Installment Financing) between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Islamic Development Bank Freetown Wash and Aquatic Environment Revamping Project in an amount of US\$ 40.0 Million.
 - (b) Framework Agreement (Installment Sale Financing) between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Islamic Development Bank Freetown Wash and Aquatic Environment Revamping Project in an Amount of US\$ 40.0 Million.
- (v) Loan Agreement Construction of Tinkonko-Kpetema-Mattru Jong Road Project Lot 1: Kpeteme-Mattru Jong between the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Arab Bank for Economic Development in Africa (BADEA) in an amount of US\$ 25,000,000.

The Minister of Trade and Industries, **Dr. Edward Hinga Sandy**, presented the objects and reasons of the aforementioned agreement in the said motion to the House and moved for its ratification.

The Minister of Trade and Industries, **Dr. Edward Hinga Sandy**, responded to the issues raised by Hon. Members and again moved for its ratification.

Mr. Speaker put the question for vote:

The Table Clerk, **Mr. Francis Ernest Farma**, pronounced that the Government Motion by the Minister of Trade and Industries had been ratified.

9. Standing Order 23 (Personal Explanations):

The following Hon. Members stood on S.O. 23:

(i) The Deputy Chief Whip of Government Business (Hon. Alusine Kanneh of Constituency 013, Kenema District) informed the House about the death of Ms. Aminata Jalloh which took place on the 1st of June 2021. He told the House that Ms. Aminata Jalloh was a staff attached to the Parliamentary Committee on Energy as an Assistant Committee Clerk. He, further, informed the House that her funeral ceremony would take place on Friday 18th of June 2021. He pleaded to Mr. Speaker for a minute of silence to be observed for the deceased.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, asked all to rise and observe a minute of silence. He recited the following prayer as quoted: "We pray for her gentle soul to rest in perfect peace."

(ii) The Whip of Opposition (Hon. Hassan A. Sesay of Constituency 050, Tonkolili District) informed the House that the debate for the Presidential Address delivered by His Excellency Rtd. Brig. Julius Maada Bio for the Fourth Session (18th May 2021) of the Fifth Parliament had been delayed. He said that it was a statutory requirement for the said debate to be mandatorily held.

Response by Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma:

The Leader of Government Business, Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District, responded that the House had not abrogated any provision of the Standing Orders. He asked Hon. Hassan A. Sesay to direct the House to any provision that the House had violated.

Response by Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas:

The Deputy Speaker, Hon. Segepoh Solomon Thomas of Constituency 089, Bonthe District, responded that no wrong had been done concerning the debate on the Presidential Address because there was no provision stating the exact timing relating to the debate of the Presidential Address.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, informed the House that the debate on the Presidential Address would take place within the next few days. He said that a full debate of five allotted days would be engaged.





(iii) The Leader of Opposition (Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban District) informed the House that he wanted the Leader of Government Business to engage the Parliamentary Committee on Information and Communications to discuss on the Zoodlabs issue. He said that they needed to conclude the issue on Zoodlabs and SALCAB (Sierra Leone Cable Network). He also informed the House that there had been a lot of talks concerning the Black Johnson Land and Fishing Harbour issue. He said that it would be very good for the House to invite The Minister of Fisheries and Marine Resources (Hon. Emma Kowa Jalloh) to proffer better explanations for the public discuss.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, informed the House that in relation to the issue raised by the Leader of Opposition concerning the **Black Johnson Fishing Harbour**, he had drawn the attention of the relevant Ministry that the agreement which was so much invoked in the public domain needed to be laid on the Table of the House. He said that he had drawn the attention of the Minister of Fisheries and Marine Resources to that path as it was governed by Section 118 of the 1991 Constitution of Sierra Leone (Act No. 6 of 1991). He advised the Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Fisheries and Marine Resources (**Hon. Nenneh Lebbie**) to exhort the Minister of Fisheries and Marine Resources (**Hon. Emma Kowa Jalloh**) to take all necessary measures to ensure that the said agreement saw the light of day in the Chamber of Parliament.

(iv) Hon. Boston Munda of Constituency 021, Kenema District informed the House about the meeting that the Parliamentary Committee on Information and Communications had with Zoodlabs and the Ministry of Information and Communications. He said that progress was on the way to have the agreement between Zoodlabs and the Ministry of Information and Communications. He also informed the House about the Transitional Management Team regarding SALCAB.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, informed the House about a time that he summoned the Executives of Zoodlabs concerning the poor communication that the House of Parliament was having. He said that he was assured that all would be put in order, but up to then that assurance had not been carried out. He directly ordered the Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Information and Communications to summon the Executives of Zoodllabs again to inform them that there was serious defect in the communication of the House of Parliament.





(v) The Leader of Opposition (Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah of Constituency 126, Western Urban District) informed the House about a company known as F G Gold. He said he was shocked when an issue was raised in his presence regarding a license that was granted to that company on a concession. He said that it was something that the House must be looking into.

Response by Hon. Saa Emerson Lamina:

The Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Mines and Mineral Resources (Hon. Saa Emerson Lamina of Constituency 030, Kono District) responded that the Committee on Mines and Mineral Resources had done thorough job by bringing all stakeholders. He said that they were aware of F.G. Gold, and He assured the Leader of Opposition that thorough probing had been done from all the stakeholders. He said that they would love to lay their report on the Table of House on Thursday 24th June 2021.

- (vi) **Hon. Maada Afiju Kanja of Constituency 018, Kenema District** informed the House that there had been a rumour spreading on social media that the Government of the Republic of Sierra Leone had been giving Hon. Members Le 250,000,000 as Constituency Developmental Fund (CDF) annually and Le 250,000,000 as Constituency Facilitation Fees. He asked that the Leadership should educate the general public.
- (vii) **Hon. Moses B. Jorkie of Constituency 091, Bonthe District** informed the House that the documents concerning the ownership of ECOMED that ought to have been given to him by **Hon. P.C. Bai Kurr Kanagbaro Sanka III** had not been received. He said that he would not be able to pursue the issue and lay the said report because he had not laid hands on those documents.
 - Hon. P C Bai Kurr Kanagbaro Sanka III of Tonkolili District responded that there should not be blame games on that matter because the House was on recess. He said that he was expecting the Leadership of the House to look into the said matter. He said it was wise to work quietly to have all that were needed.
- (viii) **Hon. Sahr Charles of Constituency 028, Kono District** informed the House that the conditions in quarantined homes were not favourable because of the lack of the necessary facilities. He informed the House that **Hon. Komba M. Kamanda of Constituency 024, Kono District** together with his family had been in quarantine for more than a week without any food supplies or water. He called upon the House together with NACOVERC to take all necessary actions to address that issue.





(ix) Hon. Osman Wurie Jalloh of Constituency 109, Western Rural District encouraged his fellow Hon. Members to take the vaccination for the COVID-19. He informed the House that he himself had been vaccinated twice. He pleaded with all Hon. Members to do likewise. He said that the vaccination would cause no negative effect on them.

10. Suspension of Standing Order 5(2):

The motion for the suspension of S.O. 5 (2) at 3:00 p.m. was moved by **Hon. Nenneh Lebbie of Constituency 086**, **Bo District** for the proceedings to continue after the said time. The motion was seconded by **Hon. Moses B. Jorkie of Constituency 091**, **Bonthe District** and approved by the House.

Continued proceedings

(x) **Hon. Aaron Aruna Koroma of Constituency 048, Tonkolili District** informed the House that the just concluded process of confirmation and registration of the unregistered population in the Northern part of the country by NCRA was not properly conducted. He said that due to the poor planning and the logistical inefficiency of the whole process, not up to 20% of the residents in the North were covered. He asked that the House should invite the Director of the National Civil Registration Authority (NCRA) to make clarification on that matter.

Mr. Speaker's Response:

The Rt. Hon. Speaker, **Dr. Abass Chernor Bundu**, ordered the Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Internal Affairs to summon the Director of NCRA in order to discuss the matter and if necessary elevate it to the Well of Parliament.

Standing Order 5 (1):

Subject to the proviso of Standing Order 5 (1), The Leader of Government Business (Hon. Mathew S. Nyuma of Constituency 019, Kenema District) moved a motion that the House should meet on Monday 21st of June 2021. The motion was seconded by the Deputy Leader of Opposition (Hon. Ibrahim Ben Kargbo of Constituency 034, Bombali District) and approved by the House.

Adjournment:

Mr. Speaker adjourned the House to Monday 21st June, 2021 at 10:00 am. The House rose at 3:20 p.m.
