	<p><b>CONGRATULATORY STATEMENT BY MR. SPEAKER:</b></p> <p><b>Mr. Speaker</b> congratulated the Presidential nominees and hoped they would do well, referring to Mr. Michael Augustus Collier, who is currently the Acting Managing Director at Rokel Commercial Bank, he asked him to make it a point of duty to be present at meetings called by SLIEPA, as he is a Board Member. Mr. Speaker also congratulated the two female nominees.</p> <p><b>STANDING ORDER 23:</b></p> <p><b>Hon. Augustine B. Torto</b> - As Chairman of the parliamentary Committee on Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation, informed the House about his attendance at the United Nations General Assembly in New York, representing the Sierra Leone Parliament in various meetings which culminated in an amount of 1.5 million dollars worth of Ebola drugs being donated to the country.</p> <p>He further said that the drugs will be distributed to the relevant MDA's and called on the press to write and market Parliament's efforts in achieving that.</p> <p>He disclosed that he was also moved by the President's address which he delivered at the United Nations General Assembly in New York.</p> <p><b>STATEMENT BY THE LEADER OF THE HOUSE – HON. IBRAHIM R. BUNDU ON THE ISSUE OF MAINTENANCE AND MISUSE OF GOVERNMENT QUARTERS:</b></p> <p>Hon. Ibrahim R. Bundu disclosed that the lack of maintenance and the misuse of Government quarters by senior Civil Servants is on the increase. He called on the Chairman, Parliamentary Committee on Works and the Head of the Civil Service, to look into that matter and to explain why that was happening.</p> <p>He concluded by saying that Government quarters must not be misused, diminishing the prospects of young people who would like to enjoy the facilities also. He warned that if the situation persists then the culprits would be evicted from the quarters.</p> <p><b>Hon. Jusufu B. Mansaray</b> - Reiterated the Leader's concerns and suggested that the Parliamentary Committee on Public Affairs should also be involved by interfacing with the other relevant Committees dealing with that matter.</p>

	<p><b>Hon. Patrick Foyah</b> - As a rejoinder to the matter raised by the Leader, said that not only Government quarters are being misused and lacking maintenance, but Government properties and vehicles are also being misused.</p> <p>Secondly, he said that Parliamentary Committee meetings should not be limited immediately after the sitting of Parliament, but that a work plan should be put in place specifying different times and places for meetings and, in the light of the foregoing, asked that the Clerk of Parliament play a leading role on that matter.</p> <p><b>Hon. P.C. Joseph Alie Kavura Kongomoh II</b> - He said that even though the Ebola victims and death-rate are on the decrease, survivors are still posing a threat to others, citing a survivor from Freetown who became ill and later died close to his Chiefdom. That survivors still carry the virus in their sex organs and breasts in the case of women. He further stated that we should still go by the bye-laws and regulations and that survivors should be properly taken care of to avoid another outbreak. He called on the Leader to re-echo that issue to the Government.</p> <p><b>Hon. Helen Kuyembeh</b> - She buttressed the issue raised by Hon. P.C. Joseph Alie Kavura Kongomoh II by disclosing that she attended a World Bank meeting geared towards post Ebola strategies in which Parliamentarians in the West African region were commended for the role they have played so far in combating the spread of the Ebola disease, since Members of Parliament are closer to their constituencies and the rural areas.</p> <p><b>Hon. Mohamed K. Tholley</b> - That on his way home to devil hole, he met a lab technician and two nurses at Rokupa junction by Benz Garage who were disgruntled because their salaries have not been paid for two months and that they were threatening to use the blood of an infected person to exacerbate the situation. He called on the Health Committee to invite the Minister of Health and Sanitation to look into that matter.</p> <p>Secondly, he told the House that the issue regarding some police officers who were unlawfully dismissed is yet to be resolved. He further informed the House that Bo District had been free from the Ebola outbreak for over 42 days then.</p> <p><b>STATEMENT BY MR. SPEAKER:</b></p> <p>Mr. Speaker informed the House that the Inspector-General of Police is still willing to come to Parliament to deal with that matter and that</p>

Bai Kurr Kanagbaro Sanka III, Chairman for the Committee on Internal Affairs, is still occupied with Ebola issues in his Chiefdom and in that regard called on the Deputy Chairman Hon.
